Pleasant Cheney Taylor son of William Taylor and Elizabeth Griffith, was born at Burlington, Vermont, on February 8th, 1837. He was one of a family of fourteen children as he learned early enough to share the work and responsibilities of the home. In the spring of 1858 he went with his parents to Mendota, Wisconsin. During his life in the various locations he began to develop his skill of three spades.

He stayed and brought to his family by members of Pioneer Camp for the winter of 1859 and though he was then but a boy of twenty of age this event changed the whole course of his life, for his family was driven from place to place and his father's home was but a small shack finally. He remained in the west and located peacefully in Idaho. He, himself, became a member of the church in 1857 leaving behind a family of three children and continued by his father, William Taylor, he was present with the family at the laying of the cornerstone of the temple at Fort Worth.

The family lived four times in seven years staying all the while and persecution through which the saints passed at this time in this country from their homes and expelled from the state of Missouri by order of Thomas B. Bugee. Through exposure his father finally passed away in Sept. 1839. Pleasant then

was at this time only twelve years of age but he assumed a great deal of responsibility for a boy of such tender years. The family had lost so much land and other property through the persecutions of mobs and disbelievers that they were left destitute. They accepted a city lot in Nauvoo from the prophet Joseph Smith and the boys erected a log house on it for their mother. Later they rented a farm from Winifred Fox and shared in the crops harvested. They worked here for three years and Pleasant then was present when the cornerstone of the Nauvoo Temple was laid. He labored on the temple every fourth day until it was completed.

Before leaving Nauvoo he became a member of the Mormon Legion and was a member of the police force. He often stood guard at the home of the prophet at night. He remembered well the feelings of the saints at the time the prophet Joseph and his brother Hyrum left to go to Carthage and the next morning after the were martyred he saw the first vengeance being the news of the tragedy to Nauvoo. He was present when the bodies were brought back to Nauvoo and realized the grief of the saints. He was among the saints when their new leaders were chosen & he said that when Brigham Young came into the Bowerly where they were assembled he, as well as many others,

FAMILY HISTORY

rose to his feet, feeling sure that the Prophet Joseph Smith had been resurrected and even after Brigham Young began to speak he still thought of it as the Prophet. After this incident the Saints felt sure that Brigham Young had been divinely chosen to take the place of their beloved prophet Joseph.

Pleasant Street was ordained, a Deacon in the year 1840 and in 1843 was ordained a seventy. In the spring of 1845 he was permitted to go with his mother, his sister and his brother Joseph to the temple in Nauvoo and sealed his endowments.

When Stenerson died and a mob demanded that the Saints leave their beautiful city of Nauvoo their hearts and the temple as dear to them, they prepared to do this order. Pleasant Street was one of the first men called upon by Brigham Young to go and pioneer the way. On Feb. 8th 1846, which was his nineteenth birthday they crossed the Mississippi River on the ice and camped on Sugar Creek, where they remained for two weeks. They travelled only about three miles a day as they were preparing the roads, building bridges and making it more pleasant for those who were to follow. At Pleasant there they built houses, fenced a large farm and later planted crops. At Piquah they not only built houses, but also dug wells. The roads were so steep and slippery and the horses so weak for lack of food that many times the men would tie ropes to the wagon and pull on the ropes

to get over the worst places. Their food during these strenuous times consisted chiefly of packed corn and wild onions. It was at this time that the Lord sent a large flock of quail into their camp. Many of the birds were killed and prepared for food which the men were indeed grateful. When they reached the Lee Mines River

President Young advised Pleasant Street to return a help his widowed mother after traveling nearly one hundred miles his clothes and shoes were so ragged and worn that he was almost naked when he met his mother during her team of oxen. He returned with her as far as Council Bluffs. They settled at a little place called Alford's Bluffs and he and his brother built a house for their mother and made her comfortable. Their mother across the cloth and made him a suit of clothes about this time the U.S. Government called for 500 men from among the Saints to go down to San Antonio with General Taylor, this company was known as the Mormon Battalion. He was a serious witness Pleasant Street was unable to but his brother, Joseph, volunteered and was accepted.

On his nineteenth birthday he sent out

When Pleasant Street Taylor returned, aged and weary to meet his mother in the summer of 1846 he also set China trade. When he saw how far the first time she was seated high upon

FAMILY HISTORY

average seat driving an ox team. He said she looked so pretty with her dark eyes, pink cheeks and her crisp clean sun-brown hair. "I have seen the woman and going to marry" he declared. He did not make a mistake for they were married in June on February 27, 1817, the ceremony being performed by Thomas Hudson, six days after his marriage. He went to Missouri to obtain work.

He secured work cutting wood at a wage of twelve dollars a month, later he worked on a flour boat and still later at breaking dams. In the spring of 1848 he did some farm work for which he received 38 cents a day. At last, however, he managed to buy himself a team but gave the horse to his mother in the spring of 1849 to enable her to move to Utah. That same year his brother Joseph returned from the Mexican war and walked home to secure an outfit to go west. They crossed the Mississippi River on May 10th 1850. They endured the long hard journey with much sickness and some of their company died of cholera. They reached Salt Lake City on September 5, 1850. They were indeed happy to have accompanied the project for which she had embarked and working for so long.

They first settled at Kayaville, later at Ogden and still later at Thruville good weather and very

anxious to make the most of his possessions. He soon had a horse built and his land under cultivation. Just during the summer of 1852, because of the hostility of the Indians President Young called on the church to move to certain points and build forts for safety. Pleasant Street and his family moved to Brigham Fort and he helped to build a wall of defense. One hundred and ten families a day came at that place, this was two miles from the fort and he had to be on his guard continually. When he went to work on his farm, he took his gun with him.

In April 1855 he drove an ox team and went to Salt Lake City to conference. While there he was called to go on a mission to the Indians. He was profited by President Brigham Young that if he was faithful he would be blessed and would have the privilege of seeing one of the three prophets. This promise was later fulfilled. May 15, 1855, in company with twenty of other elders, he started on the mission. He travelled some 300 miles into the north and settled on the Salmon River. He built a house on forty to live where they met, where building and the Indian language. The Indians were quite friendly some of them accepting of the church, but all

FAMILY HISTORY

skined up while among the Indians and much warfare and trouble arose. The Indians became more hostile and the savian - moved back to be always on their guard.

Pleasant then Taylor had disease manifestations many times during this mission. Once while in search of their horses which the Indians had stolen, the men travelling fast when he saw the form of a man hand pass before him pointing north. They turned and travelled north about three miles and found their horses. At another time he had a prophetic dream acting on this dream he had all the people move from the old fort to the new one. In a few hours time five hundred, painted yelling Indians were on the warpath and would have killed all the white men had they not moved to the new fort. During that they had been thwarted in their designs the Indians became furious they set fire to loads of hay while the men were still huddled to the Europeans. The open saw ^{frantically} through the woods trying to loose themselves from the flying hay. The Indians killed one guard and took possession of about 500 of the men cattle and horses. One of the guards escaped but several of the brethren were missing. Pleasant then and some of the others went

in search of the missing one. The hills were screaming with Indians. They found George Mc Bride dead and scalped and Andrew Snigley pierced by needles and arrows. The men could be bitten of their clothing and saved back the dead and wounded. When men were sent to Utah for help. They avoided the stean for five miles to avoid being tracked. There were five hundred Indians against thirty men. The men straightened out their eyes then and put hands on them, fired pistols in the fort with guns at them. The Indians stood at a distance with the birds scalp on a pole in a threatening manner. The women helped in every way they could. Pleasant then said "There we stand ready to cut down and destroy the same Indians whom we had come to preach the Gospel, but the night they were to attack us three hundred men came to our aid. The Indian chief went to find out if the men wanted to fight but when the men told them they wanted peace and were going to leave, the Indians acknowledged they had done wrong, some of them even shed tears. They wanted the white men to stay. This peace was restored. The men had about two thousand bushels of grain which they left with the Indians.

James Taylor, Gentleman - as was the old style for those of foreign birth - appeared to be the first arrival in America. He was born in Cardiganshire, about 1615 and in 1635 is found living in Caroline Co., Virginia, in possession of large tracts of land including a homestead of 7,000 acres on the Mattaponi River, Wyndell Parish, Va. This first James married twice. His first wife was Pympson (surname unrecorded) and by her, had two sons and two daughters. One of these sons was James, later married Martha Thompson, grand-daughter of Sir Robert Thompson of England. James the second was a colonel in the Colonial militia and fought in the Indian Wars. He was also a member of the House of Burgessess from King and Queen Counties. and gave a dinner to General Lee the day after his death. An interesting record from Henrico's History of Virginia shows that he once received 15000 lbs. of cotton for a survey of the boundaries between Carolina, North Carolina, Maryland, and Orange Counties Virginia.

The second wife of James the first was Mary Theyer, and by her he had four sons and four daughters.

Through this second wife comes the connection of the Taylor family with that illustrious patriot, George Washington. Mary Theyer was a daughter of Roger Theyer and Mildred Washington, his wife. Mildred was an aunt of George Washington and acted as his godmother on the occasion of his baptism in 1732. After the death of James, the second, his widow received 16,000 lbs. of tobacco from the Burgessess.

James and Martha Thompson had nine children, among whom were Thomas and Zachary. Thomas Taylor married Anne Wilson and was the grandfather of James Madison, 4th president of the United States. Zachary Taylor was born in 1707 and married, first, Elizabeth Lee, and as his second wife, Catherine Blackburn. Among Elizabeth's four sons children was Colonel Richard Taylor, who was aide-de-camp to General George Washington during the Revolutionary War. Colonel Richard Taylor married Sarah Stratton, a descendant of the fifth generation of William Atholus the colonist (1673). After the Revolution of 1789,
