
We hope everyone finds peace and joy during this holiday season as we celebrate the birth of our Redeeming Savior! How blessed we are!

Musa had to make a hard choice to attend his baptism or fulfill a commitment at his work. But after he was challenged to read Mark 8: 35-37, Musa made the right choice. It was a wonderful day!

Elder Saumalo wrote, “My companion right now is Elder Kabongo, but in three weeks I’ll be train-

ing a new missionary! I’m excited for that! He is a Frenchman, so I will be helping him learn English too. I’m curious how that will go because I’ll help him with English, but we’ll have to teach in Kalokawa! So, I hope everything will be alright - Ha, Ha!”

Elder Saumalu’s mission president, President Clark, recently wrote to the missionaries: “One year



ago, Liberia had no stakes. The Bushrod Island Stake was created last November and the Monrovia Stake in May of this year. We received notice this week that on December 9, the

Caldwell and Paynesville Stakes will be created, making four brand-new Liberia stakes in the Monrovia metro area, all created in a period of just 13 months. Over 90 percent of the members in Liberia will now be living in fully organized stakes of Zion led by local leaders, which is nothing short of amazing.

“We also just received approval to “enlarge the borders” of the Church in Liberia, which is currently concentrated almost exclusively in Monrovia, the capital city ....

“These two events mark a pivotal point in the maturity and growth of the Church in Liberia. They also clearly witness Elder Bednar’s message to Sister Clark and me this summer that Liberia is the focal point of the Restoration at this point in history.

“Every one of us has been called to Liberia to extend the marvelous spread of the gospel here and to build a foundation for future generations of saints and missionaries who will, in turn, bless the entire Church through their pure, uncluttered application of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We’re livin’ the dream!”


