Learning From the Past *by Brother Andy Schnebly*



My twin sister, Sandy and I have always liked sharing our birthday month of February with George Washington (Feb 19) and Abraham Lincoln (Feb 12). Fifty years ago, their birthdays were celebrated as separate holidays. In 1968, congress combined them to be celebrated on the third Monday in February as Presidents Day. Both men are invaluable to the history of our great country.

George Washington has been referred to as the “Father of Our Country.” Church leaders have said that George Washington was foreordained to this role as a military and political leader. Heavenly Father preserved the Americas for the restoration of the gospel. Washington fulfilled his assignment to secure a free land where the events of the restoration could unfold.

Heavenly Father preserved America as a place where the gospel of Jesus Christ could be restored. The Book of Mormon states in 2 Nephi 10: “And this land shall be a land of liberty ...” and 1 Nephi 30: “Nevertheless, thou beholdest that the Gentiles ... have been lifted up by the power of God above all nations, upon the face of the land which is choice above all other lands ... for the land of their inheritance.”

George Washington was aware of the significance of his role as the leader of the new country and the divine assistance he was given. He wrote in a letter on May 13, 1776 to Rev. William Gordon, “No man has a more perfect reliance on the alwise [sic] and powerful dispensations of a Supreme Being than I have, nor thinks His aid more necessary.” He also stated, “I have only been an instrument in the hands of Providence.”

In doing family history, we discovered that my 5th great-grandfather, John Cheston (born in Bristol, England April 14, 1748, and immigrated to the colonies) had enlisted in the Continental Army in New Jersey on December 24, 1775. He fought in the battle of Trenton on December 26, 1776. This is the battle in which Washington and his troops crossed the ice flow that clogged Delaware River on Christmas day and defeated the British. I am proud of my forefather who fought with Washington and




Elder Mitchell Dalley
