

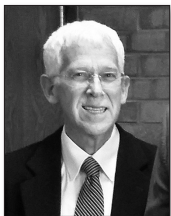

## May Is For Remembering *by Brother Andy Schnebly*



President Russell M. Nelson, in April Conference 2010, said, “While the family is under attack throughout the world, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints proclaims, promotes and protects the truth that the family is central to the Creator’s plan for the eternal destiny of his children.” Malachi 4:6 states: “And He shall turn the heart of the fathers [and mothers] to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers [and mothers] ...”

There are two important dates in May that relate to these two statements from prophets.

May 13 is Mother’s Day. It became an official holiday in 1914. Mother’s Day is a day to celebrate and honor our mothers and grandmothers, whether living or deceased. We remember their sacrifice, their council, their recipes, their funny stories, their love, their perfume, their life lessons, their love of the Gospel and the testimony of the Savior and His atonement. They have enriched and blessed our lives.

May 28 is Memorial Day which was initially named “Decoration Day.” Observance began after the Civil War to remember those who lost their lives in that great tragedy. It became an official holiday in 1971. It continues to be a day to reflect on the lives of men and women who lost their lives in the different wars and has expanded to remember all those who have passed away. On Memorial Day we can remember our friends and relatives who have passed away. We gather together and place flowers on their graves. We reminisce about how our lives were intertwined. Cemeteries are still dotted with small American flags intermingled with the beautiful flowers honoring the men and women who served in the armed forces. Just as we remember the influence of our mothers, we remember the impact on our lives of our other family members and friends.



Recently, attention to our ancestors and our responsibility to them was kindled by lyrics of the academy award winning song “Remember Me” by Benjamin Bratt from the movie “Coco.” *“Remember me though I have to say goodbye. Remember me. Don’t let it make you cry forever if I’m far away. I hold you in my heart and sing a secret song to you each night we are apart. Remember me.”*

The significance of family history and temple work has been revealed. We have the responsibility and opportunity to link our families together forever. We are encouraged to search for our ancestors and perform temple work for them so they can have all the blessings of the restored gospel of Jesus Christ. May we take advantage of the beautiful Bountiful Temple which is in our neighborhood. May we remember warmly our family members who are waiting to greet us again.

**May 13th:** *"Precious Gifts from God"* by M. Russell Ballard HAPPY MOTHERS DAY

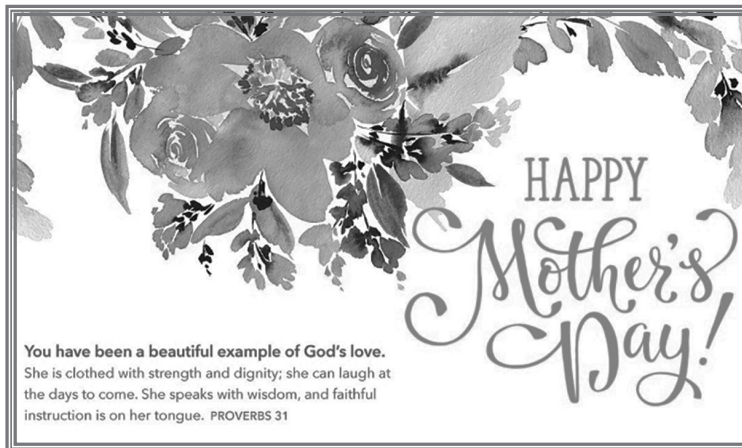
**May 20th:** *"Ministering As The Savior Does"* by Jean B. Bingham

## Eagle Scout Court of Honor

Flags needing to be retired can be placed in this box and Christopher and his troop, along with other troops may then take care of the flags properly. Both boys spoke about their experiences in scouting and what they have learned through the program. Alex and Christopher thanked their leaders, mentors, families and fellow scouts for the help and support which they received.

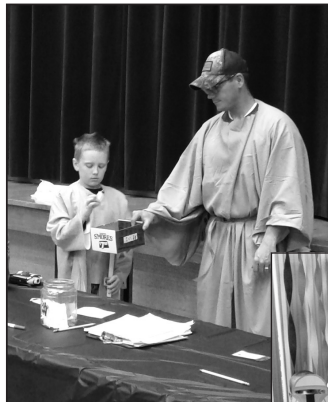
