Ministering to the One *by Bishop Michael Wright*



It has been several months since President Russell M. Nelson, our Prophet, announced the change from home/visiting teaching to ministering. During the past several months, I have conscientiously looked for acts of ministering within our ward boundaries. I have witnessed several acts of what I would define as ministering. President Thomas S. Monson taught in an address: “Often small acts of service are all that is required to lift and bless another: a question concerning a person’s family, quick words of encouragement, a sincere compliment, a small note of thanks, a brief telephone call.”

The scripture that defines ministering is found in Mosiah 23: 18 “Therefore they did watch over their people, and did nourish them with things pertaining to righteousness.” However busy we become, there are always many opportunities to bless the lives of others when we seek opportunities. The art of ministering is really centered around one single word, “LOVE.” I have witnessed, in the last couple of weeks, a few examples that I would like to share.

I was at the grocery store and observed a sister from our neighborhood minister to another sister. This sister was helping the other through the grocery store line, and then out to her car. As I stopped to say “hello,” I heard the ministering sister say as I walked away, “I will follow you home and help you put your groceries away.” This is ministering to the “one.”

On another occasion as I was driving through the neighborhood, I saw one of our ward families ministering to a widow. The family was there together helping with yardwork. Kids were mowing lawns, while others were weeding. As I drove by I couldn’t help but think they were ministering to the “one.” On still another occasion, I watched as a neighbor helped another with home repairs. A seemingly daunting task for one person alone becomes a neighborhood project with many neighbors helping to complete the project.

While these are only a few of the many examples that are taking place in our neighborhood, I ask what each of us are doing for the “one?” The Savior so tenderly taught in the parable of the lost sheep, “leave the ninety and nine in the wilderness,” and seek the “one.” Moroni wrote “Their names were taken, that they might be remembered and nourished” I pray that we will ponder about the “one” that needs our ministering hand today and maybe even tomorrow, and pray that we will act promptly to show our love for our neighbors. In the name of Jesus Christ, Amen.

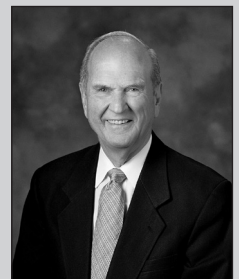

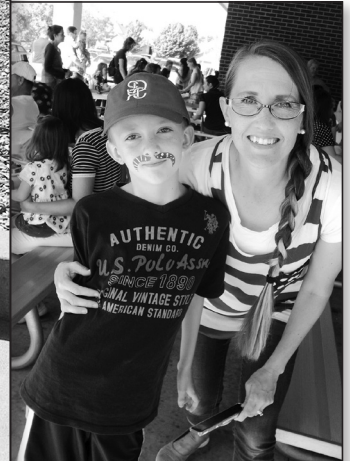
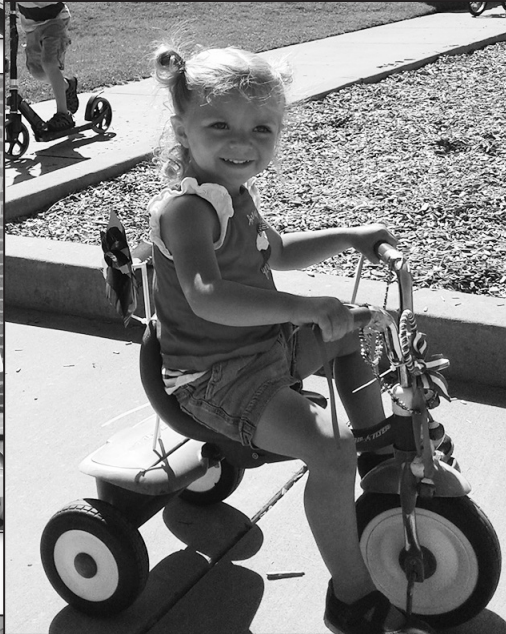
The scouts presented a very touching flag ceremony and later retired a “stars and stripes” with the traditional burning ceremony.

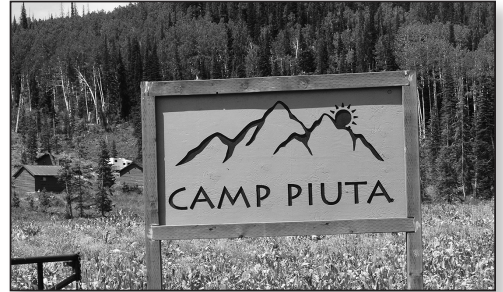
GIRLS CAMP
