A Christmas Prayer *by Bishop Michael Wright*



As we enter the Christmas season, there is something magical about this time of year. The Spirit of Christ fills the world and there is a change in people's hearts. While I may grumble about putting up the many boxes of decorations and exterior lights, the beauty that surrounds the season is not felt nor seen during the rest of the year. There is truly something special about remembering the birth of the Savior.

I remember the story called "A Christmas Prayer" by Rian Anderson. The story takes place in a small rural town in the late 1800s. The setting starts with the finishing of chores on Christmas Eve. It is a very cold night and Matt, the only child left at home, is feeling very upset because there was not enough money to get him a rifle for Christmas. After finishing the chores of the day, his Pa asks him to bundle up again because he needs his help that night.

Widow Jensen had lost her husband a year ago with three small children. Matt sits quietly wondering why he is going on the frigid night. Pa starts a conversation by telling Matt that he had been by the Jensen home earlier that day and saw Little Jakey scrounging around for some wood. They were out. He had gunysack on his feet because he had no shoes.

When they arrived, they unloaded the sleigh full of wood quietly, then Pa and Matt went to the door. When Widow Jensen opened the door, Matt saw the children huddled around the weak fire shivering. Pa said they had brought them a few things. Matt brought in the ham and flour, Pa passed out the shoes to all and the candy to the children. Widow Jensen didn't say much, but the tears in her eyes said it all. Her tears brought tears to Matt's eyes.

On the journey home, Pa told Matt he had been saving for his rifle during the year but was a little short when a man repaid a past debt, but when he drove past the Jensen home and saw Jakey, he just knew he had to do something to help them. Matt understood and tears filled his eyes. He didn't feel the cold from the overwhelming joy of helping someone in need.

CALIFORNIA CARLSBAD MISSION

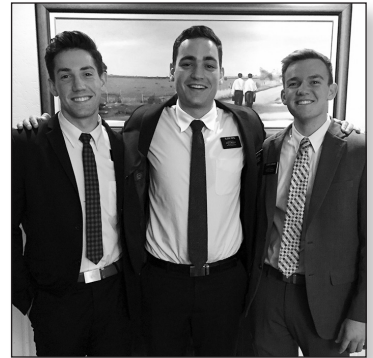

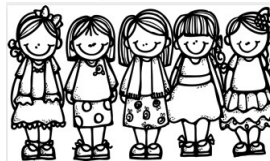
