## The Second Commandment *by Brother Andrew Schnebly*



We have started March with a ward fast to improve our love for our friends and neighbors. This is not only to improve our own efforts but for our neighbors and friends to be receptive to our caring actions. Years ago my stake president, Ralph Bradley, taught in conference: “Don’t ask Heavenly Father to bless the poor and the needy, but ask Him to show you who are the poor and the needy so you can bless them.”

You may have had an experience asking for guidance. You pray for an opportunity to help someone during the day. You asked to know who at school you can help, or you ask for a chance to make amends with someone with whom you have had a misunderstanding.

These opportunities will present themselves because you asked for them. Be ready to respond. We can keep our eyes peeled for a sidewalk or driveway that needs to be cleaned. You can call a neighbor from the store asking them if they need anything. I find this is particularly a good idea from Costco. Buy some flowers at the store and give them to a friend or neighbor as a sign that spring will come soon. Out of the blue I was prompted to give a friend \$43.00 which enabled him to pay a fine that was due. You can be a bright spot at work by taking someone to lunch. At school, you can acknowledge and spend time with someone who doesn’t have many friends. At the gym, you can assist someone who is struggling with a workout. While I was walking at the Rec Center, I took 5 X 7 study cards from a woman and quizzed her on the material she was studying for a college class. At home, you can offer to baby sit, rake leaves or mow the grass.

Last month in the Spire, Brother Gardner encouraged us to love one another and extend our lives to include others. This month we are continuing that activity. We can try and expand our circle of friends and reach out to our neighbors. Ask for opportunities to serve as Jesus would serve. “Then one of them, which was a lawyer, asked him a question, tempting him, and saying, Master, which is the great commandment in the law (there are 631 of them)? Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. The second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself” (Matthew 22:35-40).

Dear Brethren,

As your presidency, we want to continue to encourage the members of our Elders Quorum to prayerfully consider how well we are doing in our responsibilities as ministering brothers. This assignment comes through our priesthood leaders by way of commandment to all Melchizedek priesthood holders. Please read the following from the General Handbook of Instructions by which our leaders administer the affairs of the church:

*“Serving as a ministering brother is a priesthood responsibility of teachers, priests, and Melchizedek Priesthood holders.*

*“Ministering brothers represent the Lord, the bishop, and quorum leaders. They ‘visit the house of each member, exhorting them to pray vocally and in secret and attend to all family duties’ (D&C 20:51). They are assigned to families and individuals to ‘watch over ... and be with and strengthen them’ (D&C 20:53). They ‘warn, expound, exhort, and teach, and invite all to come unto Christ.’” (D&C 20:59).*

*“Ministering brothers seek to be led by the Spirit as they provide Christlike caring. They counsel with those they are assigned and seek inspiration about how best to meet their needs, using the time and*
