We remember that the world isn't always gray and cold, even if my five-year-old complains that it will never stop snowing. With every blossom that survives the deer, we are reminded of color, newness and the promise of the warm days to come.

As I write this I am sitting next to the Gulf Coast. I took the family here on a work trip with me and on our last day we had planned to go to the beach. It was the only day we had because during the other days I had to be at a conference. The kids had been looking forward to it all week - their one beach day. As the day grew closer the forecast grew darker and rainier. We got to our hotel by the water and watched the forecast only get worse. At night thunderstorms rolled and there was a 100% chance that they would continue throughout the next day.

The kids prayed and I prayed that perhaps the storm might be tempered for at least a while to let the kids enjoy a part of their day. In the morning the rain continued and the forecast was unchanged. Then the hourly forecast showed two hours of a pause in the rain, then four and then the forecast cleared completely. There were storms all around us but not where we were. The kids got to enjoy a beach day and I enjoyed a thankful heart for answers to simple prayers.

As I laid in bed listening to the thunder and torrential rain I definitely doubted that a miracle could happen, thinking that perhaps there were some storms that could not be prayed away. 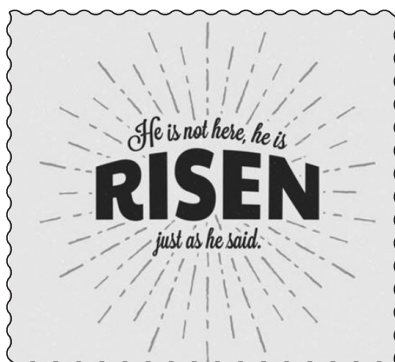


On March 5, Robin Phillips was presented the prestigious Silver Beaver award by the Great Salt Lake Council of the Boy Scouts of

campfire treat - S’mores! We love all our RS teachers and they do such an excellent job helping us understand the principles of the Gospel.

Here is the recipe for the S’more Bars:

#### Ingredients:

1/2 cup butter, softened; 3/4 cup sugar  
1 large egg; 1 teaspoon vanilla extract  
1-1/3 cups all-purpose flour  
3/4 cup graham cracker crumbs  
1 teaspoon baking powder; 1/8 teaspoon salt  
5 milk chocolate candy bars (1.55 ounces each)  
1 cup marshmallow creme

#### Directions:

In a large bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in egg and vanilla. Combine the flour, cracker crumbs, baking powder and salt; gradually add to creamed mixture. Set aside 1/2 cup for topping.

Press remaining mixture into a greased 9-in. square baking pan. Place candy bars over crust; spread with marshmallow creme. Crumble remaining graham cracker mixture over top.

Bake at 350° for 25-30 minutes or until golden brown. Cool on a wire rack. Cut into bars. Store in an airtight container.

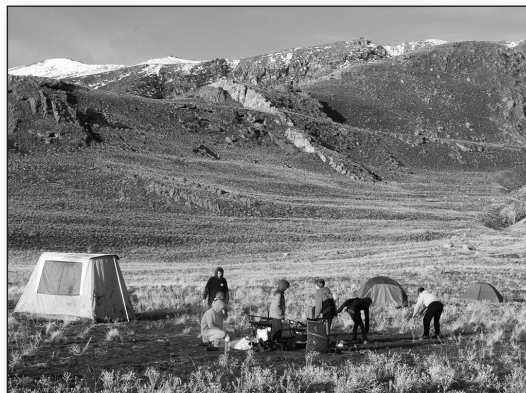

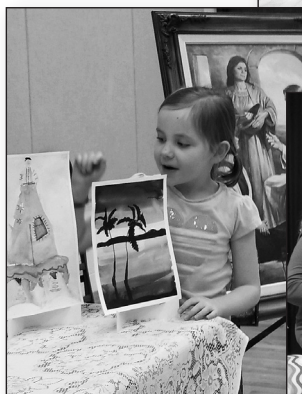

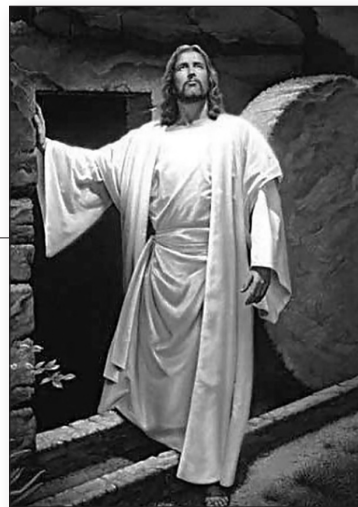
