How Will You Spend Your Summer Vacation? *by Counselor Andy Schnebly*



“Summertime and the living is easy. Fish are jumping and the cotton is high.” *Summertime*, from “Porgy and Bess” by George Gershwin.

Summertime offers different doors for each of us to open. For young children and youth, it offers a break from weekly school attendance. For graduating seniors, hopefully there is employment in a desired field or counting down days to serving a mission. For adults, there is a family vacation to plan.

In the church’s Personal Finance Class for Self-reliance, managing time is in conjunction with managing money. We need to have control over both. “If properly used, it [time] brings that which will add to your comfort, convenience, and satisfaction.” **Brigham Young**.

In the lessons, we are introduced to Sister Benkosi. (See srs.lds.org/videos.) She expresses her philosophy of time management and ministering.

“Every morning I rise before the sun. I dress and wash my face and hands. I read the scriptures. Then I make a list of what I should do that day. I think of who I might serve. I pray to know God’s will. And I listen.

“Sometimes the names or faces of people come to mind. I add them to my list. I pray for strength and wisdom. I pray that God will ‘consecrate [my] performance.’ It says that in 2 Nephi 32. I thank Him. I promise to do my best. I ask that He will do what I cannot.

“Then I look at my list. I put a ‘1’ by the most important thing, then a ‘2.’ I listen when I pray. Then I go to work. I look at number ‘1’ and try to do it first, then number ‘2.’ Sometimes things change. The Holy Ghost tells me to do something else. That is good. I work very hard, but I have peace. I know God will help me. So, with my list and the Spirit, I do what matters.

“When I finally prepare for bed, I pray. I report to Heavenly Father. I tell Him how the day went. I ask questions. I listen. I love Him. I often feel His love. I know He magnifies what I try to do. Then I have peace and I sleep.”

I encourage all of us to follow the example set by Sister Benkosi. Hopefully, we will get an “A” on our report in September: “How I Spent My Summer Vacation.”




