A Lot Has Happened in 200 Years *by Bishop Mike Wright*



As we approach springtime, and as I have been reminded, this year marks 200 years since the beginning of the restoration of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. It was 200 years ago that Joseph Smith entered the grove, which we now call “sacred” and prayed to know which religion he should join.

I recently read the account again that we find in Joseph Smith – History 1 in the *Pearl of Great Price*. I am always fascinated at the events leading up to the First Vision. As Truman Madsen put it, “there was a great religious fervor” that was taking place in the Northeast at the time. This caused Joseph to be confused as to what religion was correct.

The First Vision, with Joseph having seen God the Father and Jesus Christ, shook the foundation of religion at the time and still does today. After having such a glorious vision, for Joseph to have the wherewithall to ask the Heavenly Beings which of the sects were correct, shows his strong character. The response of the Personage that addressed him comes as a warning to all, as he was told to join none of them, “for they draw near to me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. ...”

During the early years of the church, as we all know, there were great struggles. Mobs attacked, apostasy occurred and there was financial strife. Through all the difficulties and trials, the saints still found great joy in living the restored gospel. They were committed to the church, committed to each other, and more importantly, committed to the Savior Jesus Christ.

A lot has happened in the 200 years since that First Vision that Joseph witnessed. The church has grown not only in numbers, but in various programs to help its members look to Christ as their Savior and Redeemer. There are temples that dot the earth which fulfill prophecy and makes the opportunity much easier for members to receive the personal blessings that happen there, and to redeem those family members who did not have the opportunity while on this earth to receive all the blessings of the restored gospel.

We continue to have living prophets guide us and remind all people to keep the commandments of God. There is a humanitarian focus that continues to provide services through labor and commodities to those caught in natural disasters or displacement due to wars and persecutions. The church continues to follow the teachings of the Savior - to spread His Gospel throughout the world. 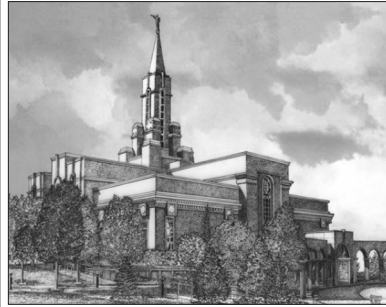

If you're looking for an easy way to get a year's supply or add to your food storage, the chart shows how you can do it for about ***\$5.00 a week**, depending on the size of your family.

Remember, it's good to store foods that you like and will eat. Also, remember that some foods, like white flour, only have a shelf-life of a year or so. It would be better to store more raw wheat.
