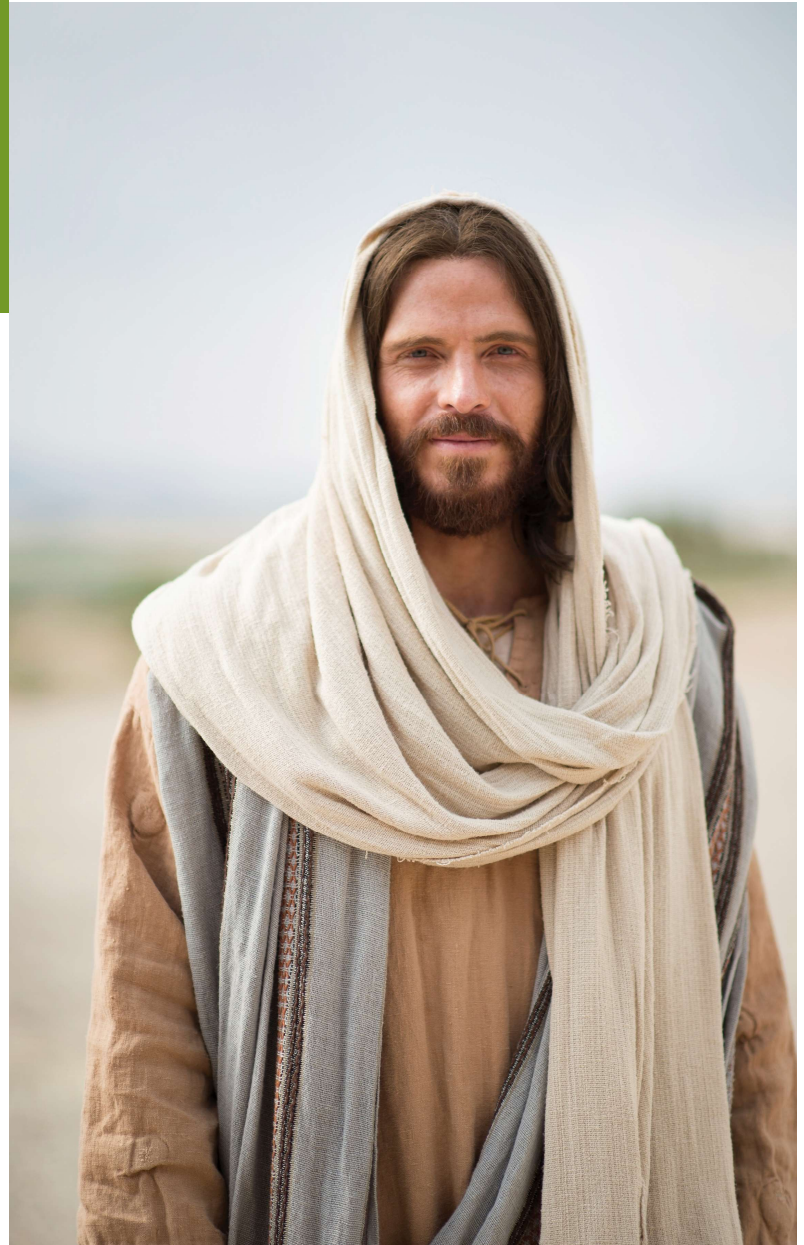

# Bishopric Message

## Great Blessings Come from Offerings

Some look at the overwhelming need in the world today and think, what can I do that could possibly make a difference?

I think all of us understand that when we, collectively, contribute our time, talents, means, and muscle to a job, the job can get done quickly and with a lot less effort from the individual. It is when the majority guard their talents and means, leaving the majority of the work to only a few that there is a feeling of being overwhelmed.

Offerings, I will use that term in its full capacity, help to bless the lives of those in need. Every dollar given to the bishop as a fast offering goes to assist the poor. When donations exceed local needs, they are passed along to fulfill the needs elsewhere.

Far too many in the world today suffer. It starts in our neighborhood and continues to thousands upon thousands of families from our own city, region, state, nation, and world. They experience want each day. They hunger. They ache with cold. They suffer from sickness. They grieve for their children. They mourn for the safety of their families. These people are not strangers and foreigners but children of our Heavenly Father. They are our brothers and our sisters. Many are fellow Saints.

By paying a generous fast offering, we teach ourselves and our children the joys of a proper fast and offering. We feel the blessings of helping those that are less fortunate or may have fallen on hard times; recover and get back to sustaining themselves. As with all sacrifice, we feel the blessings that come by giving selflessly to our Father's Kingdom and in turn He richly blesses us.

How much should we pay in fast offerings? Brother Marion G. Romney taught, "Be liberal in your giving, that you yourselves may grow. Don't give just for the benefit of the poor but give for your own welfare. Give enough so that you can give yourself into the kingdom of God through consecrating of your means and your time." Typically, we give the value of what we would eat and drink during the course of two meals as we fast. However, we are encouraged to always give generously, which I perceive to mean more than the value of two meals. I have been told many stories from friends that they chose to double their fast offering and their testimony confirms that their offering has been returned to them with even more blessings from the Lord. What faith and generosity they have!

President Gordon B. Hinckley asked: "What would happen if the principles of fast day and the fast offering were observed throughout the world [?] The hungry would be fed, the naked clothed, the homeless sheltered. ... A new measure of concern and unselfishness would grow in the hearts of people everywhere."

Fasting in the proper spirit and in the Lord's way will energize us spiritually, strengthen our self-discipline, fill our homes with peace, lighten our hearts with joy, fortify us against temptation, prepare us for times of adversity, and open the windows of heaven.

# Temple and Family History

November 2020

Many of us have missed the opportunity the past several months to attend the temple. The Bountiful Temple is now able to perform ordinances for the living. In order to do so appointments with the temple are required. We still cannot participate in proxy ordinances for our ancestors. Hopefully we will be able to do so soon. In the mean time we can do some family history work and prayerfully find names of ancestors for whom ordinance work needs to be done.

Using Family Search we can learn much about ancestors. In our ward there are over 200 members, adults and youth, who could find something about some of their ancestors on Family Search. This might be a history, pedigree, or a family group. All we have to do is go to Family Search. A lot of information is there. We might also learn something about our self. Family Search has a lot of activities available. We can learn what our name means, find out what was going in the world the year we were born, and we might be able to find out if any of our ancestors might have been pioneers. We can also post memories of some of our ancestors, perhaps a special memory or experience with a grandparent.

Each member of the family can have their own Family Search logon. That way each can see their own pedigree and learn about their own name and things that happened the year they were born. One other thing that we can do to further the work of family history is to participate in Indexing. That way we can help make information searchable online.

While we cannot participate at the present time in proxy temple ordinances, there are still several things that we can do to participate in temple or family history activity.
