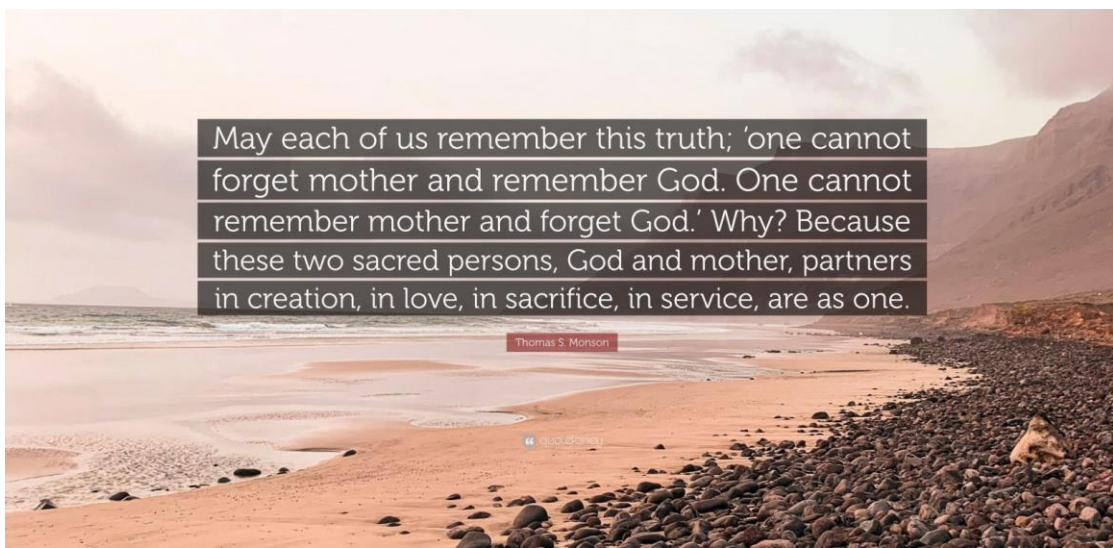
Now, there may be a few exceptions to this rule, but note many. When a child falls and gets hurt, who do they run to? Mom. When a child has a bad dream or is frightened in the night, who do they call for? Mom. When a teenager bombs a test or gets dumped by a boy/girlfriend, on who's shoulder do they cry? Mom's.

In fact, an army surgeon stated recently in an interview that, "When soldiers are dying, they all say the same thing: they call for their mother . . . "When we are hurting, emotionally or physically, why is our first inclination to call out for our moms? What is it about mom that our hearts yearn for when we are hurt, frightened, discouraged, heartbroken? I think it has to do with the fact that a mother loves us in ways no one else can or does.

I have a deep love and appreciation for my mother. I also have a strong belief in a loving Mother in Heaven. Prophets have taught that our heavenly parents work together for the salvation of the human family. "We are part of a divine plan designed by Heavenly Parents who love us," taught Elder M. Russell Ballard of the Quorum of the Twelve Apostles. President Harold B. Lee stated, "We forget that we have a Heavenly Father and a Heavenly Mother who are even more concerned, probably, than our earthly father and mother, and that influences from beyond are constantly working to try to help us when we do all we can." That being the case, I have wondered why we don't pray to our Heavenly Father and Heavenly Mother, but Jesus Christ taught His disciples to "always pray unto the Father in my name." But as President Gordon B. Hinckley said, "The fact that we do not pray to our Mother in Heaven in no way belittles or denigrates her." Indeed, as Elder Rudger Clawson wrote, "We honor woman when we acknowledge Godhood in her eternal Prototype."

Now, some of you may have mothers who, for whatever reason, have not really filled the role of a mother. Some may have not been there for you physically or emotionally. Some of your mothers may have been/are so busy battling demons of their own they had little time or emotional capital left to nurture you. You may have a mother who criticizes, belittles, or just ignores. I imagine the pain that lack of connection creates is unbearable at times. But if you look around, I hope you discover remarkable women in your life that love you like a mother. Thank God for them. And also rely on the knowledge that you have a Mother in Heaven you loves you with a perfect love.

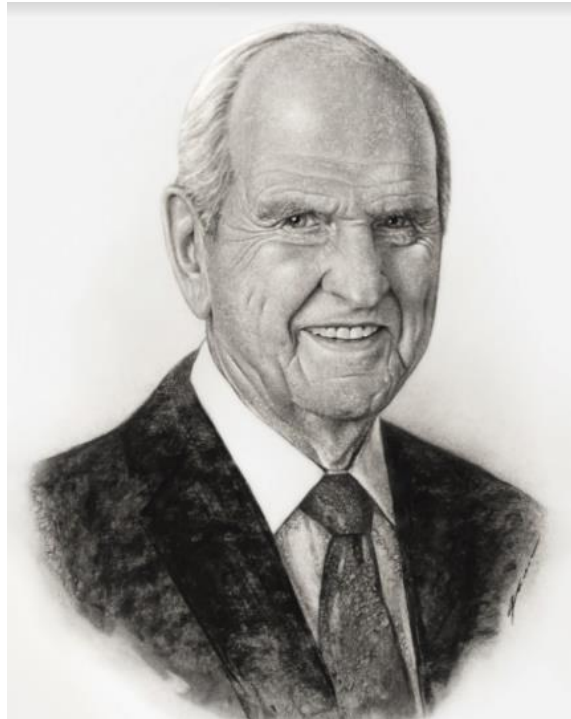

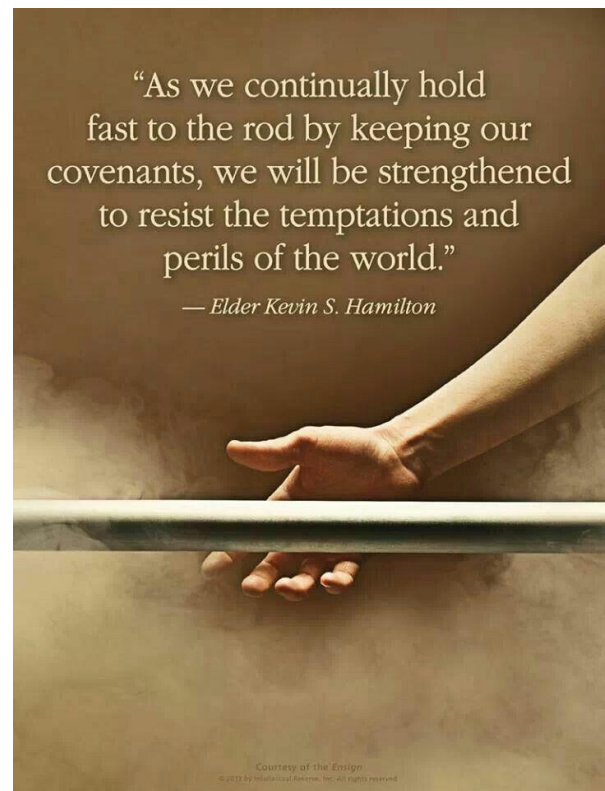

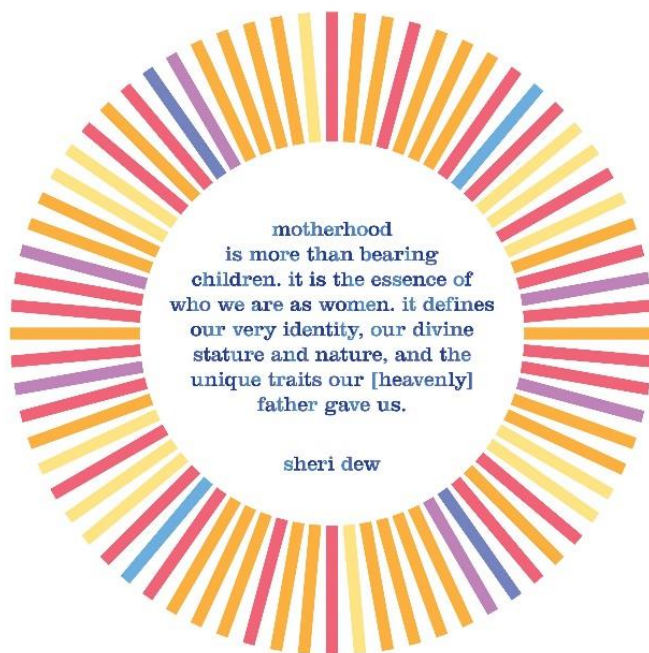


Thoughts on Motherhood
