Where is Zion?

This last week I was having a discussion with my youngest son about Zion and what that means to us today. Zion was the name given to the ancient city of Enoch in the days before the Flood. We learn from the Pearl of Great Price: "And the Lord called his people ZION, because they were of one heart and one mind, and dwelt in righteousness; and there was no poor among them. [" \(see Moses 7: 18\)](#) Remember, Zion is both a place and a people.

When I think of one heart and one mind, a word that best describes that phase would be unity. "For the unity required for Zion to flourish, we should ask ourselves if we have overcome jarrings, contentions, envyings, and strifes" (see D&C 101:6). Forgiveness of one another is essential to this unity. Jesus said, "I, the Lord, will forgive whom I will forgive, but of you it is required to forgive all men" (see D&C 64:10). We will become of one heart and one mind as we individually place the Savior at the center of our lives and follow his teachings.

The work to be done in establishing Zion consists of our individual efforts to become "the pure in heart" (see D&C 97:21). "Zion cannot be built up unless it is by the principles of the law of the celestial kingdom," said the Lord; "The law of the celestial kingdom is, of course, the gospel law and covenants, which include our constant remembrance of the Savior and our pledge of obedience, sacrifice, consecration, and fidelity." Do we strive for complete righteousness? Complete righteousness would suggest that we let go the 'things of the world' and move to a higher place. We must let go of immodesty, immorality, lustful desires found in images and music. We essentially must turn away from all evil. As Elder Neal A. Maxwell put it, "let us once and for all establish our residence in Zion and give up the summer cottage in Babylon."

In the days of Enoch, the City of Zion lasted three hundred and sixty-five years! I find it amazing that a people could be of one heart and one mind pertaining to righteousness. Enoch was truly an exemplary righteous leader. It is said that Enoch and all his people "walked with God, and he dwelt in the midst of Zion; and it came to pass that Zion was not, for God received it up into his own bosom; and from thence went forth the saying, ZION IS FLED." (see Moses 7:69) The city of Enoch or Zion was fled or taken up from this earth to dwell with God.

So where is Zion today? Can Zion still be established on this earth? Zion can be where we stand. Are as we strive for complete righteousness, Zion can be in our very hearts, families, communities as we work together in [unity](#). Zion looks like, service to family and neighbors, it looks like temple attendance, it could look like saying we are sorry when we offend or fall short, quite simply, Zion is exhibiting Christlike qualities.

I explained to my son that Zion can be in our very homes as we love each other more and remove contention (arguing with brothers). He then asked with the purest of heart, "can our home be taken up to be with God?" The answer was most reassuringly, yes! As we strive for unity and righteousness, we to can have our homes be a Zion.

#### **NEED FOR YARN:**

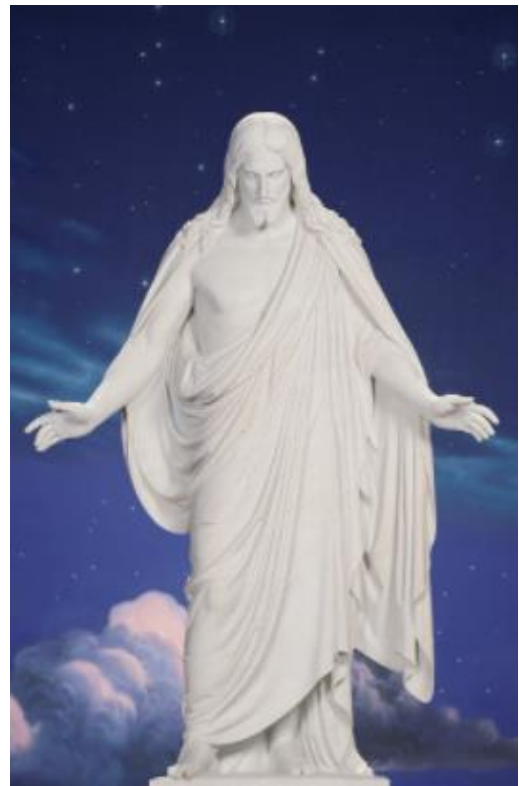

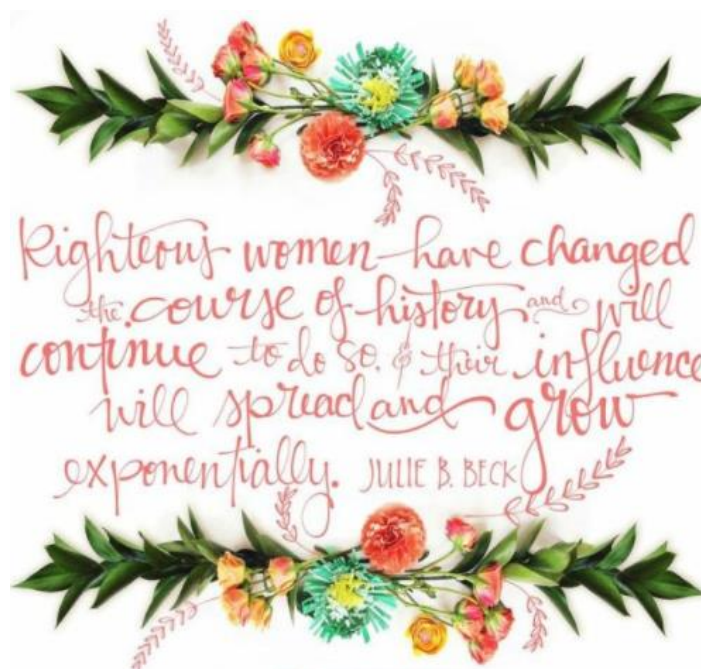

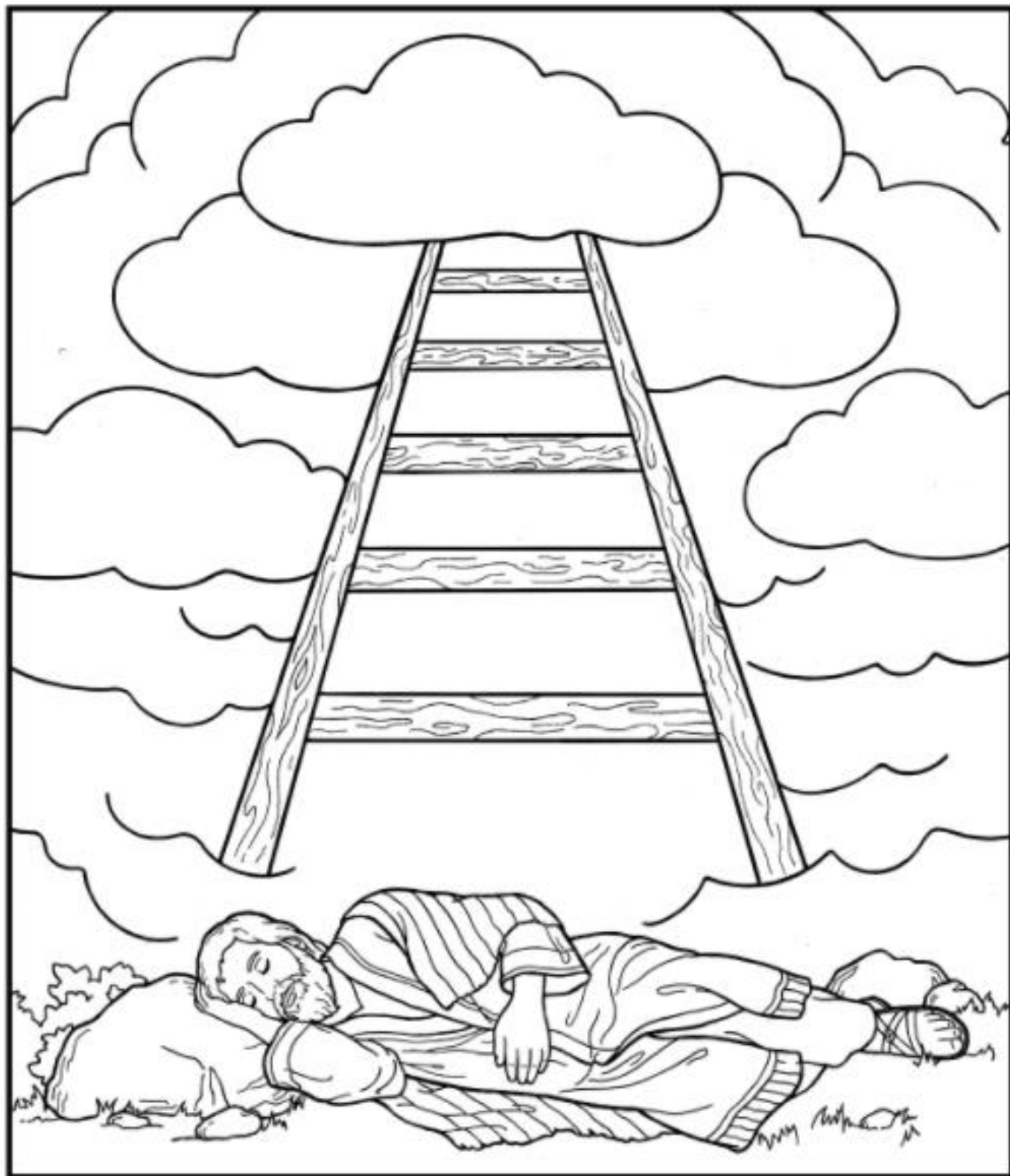
