# Bingham's Roberts: True Tall Tale

It is 7 o'clock on a Friday night at Bingham High School. The Eldon Roberts family has the gymnasium surrounded.

Dorothy Roberts, parent and first-class fan, is scurrying about peddling game programs. Eldon Roberts, proud father and Booster Club president, slips into a Bingham T-shirt, tunes his trombone, journeys back to those good ol' days, and joins the student pep band.

Tom Roberts, a 6-foot-3 sophomore, pauses in the locker room to admire his blue-and-white varsity uniform.

But it is Fred Roberts, a 6-foot-9½ basketball showman, who the college scouts filing into the gym inquire about. It is Fred Roberts who the 3,000-plus fans have come to see — mainly because Roberts is a tall tale that is true.

## Adds New Dimension

When Fred parked his size 16 sneakers, 42-inch shirt sleeves and 40 inseam slacks at Bingham High, things were bound to change.

Roberts instantly added a new dimension (or two) to an already tradition-rich program.

He climbed the ladder quickly. As a sophomore, Roberts (then 6-foot-6 and still growing) compiled a 12.2 scoring average and begin to show glimpses of stardom. The flashes of brilliance came in closer segments during his junior season. Fred intimidated the opposition for 21.4 points per game and 13 rebounds. He was now 6-foot-8 and, you guessed it, still growing.

"I remember I was about 6-2

in the ninth grade," chuckled Roberts. "But by the time I began my sophomore year I was 6-6. I haven't stopped growing since. I've grown about an inch and a half or two inches every year since. But I've done a lot of running to keep my coordination in tune with my growth.

"When I was young I saw all those big guys playing basketball who couldn't move around," continued Roberts. "They were just big and clumsy. They couldn't dribble or anything. They'd just stand underneath the basket and wait for the ball. I didn't want to be like them. I used to watch Cornbread Maxwell (a 6-8 guard-center who played for North Carolina-Charlotte), and I knew that's the way I wanted to be."

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Once Roberts returned to basketball full time, his injured left eye quickly regained its accuracy. And so did Fred. His senior season has surpassed even his own expectations.

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"That would be something if we could win the 4-A championship after winning the 3-A last year," assured Roberts. "The coaches are a little better, the players are better, and you face a tough game every week in the 4-A. Those are the basic differences."

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"I'm looking for a college where I'll fit in and feel comfortable with the coaches and players," continued Roberts. "My mother would like me to hurry and commit myself so the recruiters won't call and come by any more, but I'm not ready."

Will Fred follow in his brother's footsteps and make BYU his college camp?

"There is a little magnetism pulling me toward BYU because Glen is there," agreed Fred. "But I try to put that out of my mind and give all the schools equal consideration.
