



He loved nature and enjoyed being in the outdoors.



The marriage ceremony was performed by Nicholas Smith on Saturday morning in the Salt Lake


L. D. S. temple and the reception was held in the evening at the home of the bride's parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Asper, 21 I street.

The bridegroom is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Young of Bluewater, N. M.


The couple are now on a honeymoon trip in Idaho, and when they return they'll make Salt Lake City their home.
