

29-Year Tour Ends For Police Captain

"It has been a rewarding experience."

That's how Capt. Wilford T. Young sums up his slightly less than 30 years as a member of the Salt Lake Police Department.

His 29-years-plus is the next to longest time spent by one officer in number of continuous years of service. "And, I don't regret a minute of it," Capt. Young emphasizes.

Thursday was the final day on

the job for the commander of the radio terminal. He has headed that division since being promoted to captain in 1958.

"Wilf" starts his retirement Friday, plans to have a big birthday celebration in July when he turns 65 — and then will spend the remainder of the summer fishing.

Engraved Badge

Police Chief Dewey J. Fillis presented Capt. Young with an engraved badge that reads: "To Capt. Wilford Young, for 29 years of faithful service in law enforcement." A cake was presented during the regular staff meeting of command level officers.

Capt. Young joined the department in 1937 after moving to Salt Lake City from Blue Water, N.M.

Promoted to a sergeant in 1944, he became a lieutenant in 1949 and a captain in 1958. It was in the rank of sergeant, however, that he spent "his best years" Capt. Young said.

Under 10 Chiefs

Capt. Young, who served under 10 chiefs during his police career, remarked that morale of the department is very high at present — "probably the best ever."

"Chief Fillis is giving the men a department to be proud of," he concluded.

Chief Fillis was liberal in praise of the retiring captain. "He has been one of the finest men to work with and to have on the department," the boss said of Capt. Young.
