

Restored Marriott-Slaterville log cabin dating to 1850s to have public open house

MARRIOTT-SLATERVILLE — A log cabin from Utah's pioneer days has gone from cow pasture relic to historical display item.

After a decade of restoration efforts, it's about to open its doors in an effort to educate the public about life in the days of pioneer settlement of the West.

A public open house is slated for the Edwin & Leah Smout Log

Cabin this Saturday at 11 a.m.

The log cabin, located behind the Marriott-Slaterville City Offices at 1570 W. 400 North, dates back to 1859, according to a plaque at the site.

According to Jean Branch, a volunteer with the Susan Marriott Camp of the Daughters of Utah Pioneers, or DUP, who helped bring the log cabin to its current location and restore it, the log cabin restoration has

been a long process.

"We've been working on this log cabin for about 10 years to restore it," she said. "This little log cabin was sitting out in the fields where it was moved from the Mound Fort area. It was dilapidated, it had no roof, no floor, the north side was missing and the cows in the field had made it their home, so you can imagine what it looked like and what it was like inside."

In addition to wear and tear done by cattle and time, she described the logs that had remained on site as being "almost petrified" due to the fact that they'd been exposed to years of irrigation water.

Branch said the DUP partnered with Marriott-Slaterville in 2014 to bring the cabin to a new home in the city.

"We got a couple of guys that tore it apart, numbered the logs that were left and relocated it down by Venture Academy School back in by Four Mile Creek, which was a wonderful setting but it was kind of hidden," she said. "These two men went up and got logs in the mountains to rebuild the north wall and just made it gorgeous. It was like the original log cabin."

However, disaster would befall the first restoration attempt.

"Windows were broken out, doors were broken, graffiti was written all over and marijuana parties were held," Branch said. "We just had a horrible time."

The cabin was subsequently moved to its current location behind the Marriott-Slaterville City Offices, where restoration work would resume.

Branch said it was then time to fill the cabin with items that may have filled pioneer homes.

"Then us DUP ladies went to work and we've found artifacts, antiques, refurbished them and put them in there to the period of around 1900," she said. "We even have the original chamber pot that was in that little log cabin in there today. It's unbelievable the stories we can tell."

Plans are to tell those stories to as many people as possible.

"In the fall, we will invite the fourth graders of the Weber County schools to come for a private tour and tell them how life was back in the 1800s — show them how the butter was made, how they went to the bathroom at night, how they threaded on a sewing machine," she said. "These kids don't have any idea. We think it's going to be a great addition to the community."

A private dedication of the log cabin was done by members of the city and the DUP last Saturday, but this weekend's festivities will be open to the public.

"We won't have the long program and the histories and all the dignitaries — it will be a short program — but we want the community to know about this," Branch said. "It's a tribute to all of the pioneers that came out here, made the sacrifice, left everything. Some of them never made it and sacrificed their lives, but they came out and the stories never end. It's a way to honor them, cherish our heritage and hope that others can come and enjoy it as well."



Aunt Delphie Bingham's Death

November 25, 1918

On a sad note, a year after I was born, mother received word that her sister Rhodelpha Knight Bingham, passed away. In the early part of 1918 Aunt Delphie became pregnant with twins, a boy and a girl.

She and the twins were victims of the Great Flu Epidemic of 1918. Dephie nursed her little sons, Delos and Delbert who both fell ill. A doctor was called to the home and he pronounced it influenza. She contacted the flu from them. She delivered twins prematurely Sunday night November 24, 1918 and died the following evening.

My mother, Nellie, was very close to her only sister and it is of the opinion of Aunt Gert and Uncle Leland that their mother, Nellie, never really got over her sisters untimely, early death.

She always had a special fondness for Delphie's little sons and kept in close contact with them as they grew.

The little boys were raised by their Grandmother Bingham who was very good to them until their father remarried.

Uncle Delbert Bingham married Mary Pearl Burton January 12, 1921. She proved to be a very loving and kind woman and mother.

Delos E. Bingham

MARRIOTT/SLATERVILLE - Delos Eugene Bingham died at his home surrounded by his loving family on August 4, 2006, two months short of his 95th birthday.







In 1939, the National Invitation Tournament was the more prestigious postseason basketball tournament, but Delbert "Bus" Bingham and his Utah State teammates weren't disappointed at all to be playing in the first-ever NCAA tournament instead.

"We were happy to get the chance to start the NAAs because anybody that was halfway smart knew that was going to become the biggest thing, and it is," Bingham said.

He was right. The current NCAA tourney is a 65-team event worth hundreds of millions of dollars in TV revenues and ticket sales, but that inaugural tournament 66 years ago had only eight teams.

In his first year at Utah State after two seasons at Weber College, Bingham led the Big Seven Conference in scoring as a 5-foot-10-inch guard. Colorado, the

conference champs, went to the NIT, so it was Utah State that took the train west to San Francisco to take on Oklahoma in the Western Regionals.

Bingham's Ags, coached by E.L. "Dick" Romney, fell to Oklahoma 50-39 in the first round of the tourney March 20, 1939. USU won its consolation game against Texas 51-49 the next night and rode the train back with Oregon players, the eventual champions. The Ducks were on their way to Evanston, Ill., where they defeated Ohio State.

might have been had the Aggies won their first game.

"If we'd have won two more games, we'd have been the national champions," he said.

Now 90 years old, Bingham will be watching another first round of the NCAA tourney when No. 14-seed Utah State tips off against No. 3-seed Arizona in Boise today at 5:20 p.m.

"If it's on TV, I never miss it," Bingham said.

"Once you're into athletics, you're in it for life."

Bingham's start down the sporting path might have been looked at by his religious leaders as a start down a different sort of road.

"We used to sneak over into the old church house in the wintertime and got in some good practice," he said.

Some of his partners in crime, Clyde and Floyd Morris, joined him at both Weber College and Utah State, and Bingham credits their successes to those hours in the cold gym. Minor indiscretions like the church-trespassing led Bingham to being called "Bus," a nickname within a nickname.

"I was probably mischievous and somebody (most likely his grandmother) probably said, 'Now listen here, Buster Brown,'" he said.

Still, sneaking into the church paid off in life experiences for Bingham, if not helpful in holier spheres.

After another year at Utah State, Bingham joined a barnstorming basketball team called the Ogden Pioneers for a year before joining the military as a glider pilot in World War II.

He wasn't paid for the tour, but he had a lot of fun on the court.

"All we wanted to do was play," he said.

Being 5 feet 10 inches tall, the "midget of the team" according to a Pioneers program, didn't hold him back, Bingham said.

"I was always red-hot. I had a lot of spring in my legs at that time," he said. "What I didn't have, I made up with speed and accuracy."

I FEEL A DEEP LOVE FOR UNCLE ELMER, FOR AUNT LeVIRL, FOR AUNT THELMA AND FOR ALL OF YOU, AND SO THOUGH I MAY NOT FIND THE RIGHT WORDS TO EXPRESS MY TRUE FEELINGS, I AM GRATEFUL FOR THE PRIVILEGE TO TRY, AND I HAVE ASKED FOR DIVINE HELP. PERHAPS, IN A WAY, I SPEAK IN BEHALF OF ALL HIS NEPHEWS AND NIECES, AS I WALK DOWN MEMORY LANE WITH LOVE IN MY HEART, GREAT RESPECT FOR UNCLE ELMER KNIGHT AND GRATITUDE FOR HIS INFLUENCE IN MY LIFE.

I START 70 PLUS YEARS AGO BEFORE ELECTRICITY, AUTOMOBILES, AND THE OTHER MODERN MIRACLES CHANGED OUR WAY OF LIFE. I STAYED ALL NIGHT WITH GRANDPA AND GRANDMA KNIGHT IN SLATERVILLE. I REMEMBER GRANDMA AND HER BOYS GATHERED AROUND TWO KEROSENE LAMPS, READING THE SCRIPTURES AND GRANDPA, WITH HIS POCKET KNIFE, WHITTLING KINDLING FOR THE MORNING FIRE. I REMEMBER THE SPOOKY BEDTIME STORIES OF MY UNCLES, THE HEARTY BREAKFAST WITH GRANDPA HEAPING SUGAR ON HIS OATMEAL. I REMEMBER MANY OTHER THINGS, BUT I ESPECIALLY REMEMBER THE GOOD HUMOR AND THE LOVE THEY SHARED AS THEY PLANNED, WORKED AND LEARNED TOGETHER.

DURING THE 1918 INFLUENZA EPIDEMIC, WHEN I WAS 7 YEAR'S OF AGE AND MY BROTHER "BUS" WAS 3½, OUR MOTHER, WHO WAS ELMER'S OLDER SISTER, DIED. WE FELT A GREAT SENSE OF LOSS AND EMPTINESS, AND ALTHOUGH OUR DAD TOOK US DOWN TO WILSON LANE TO LIVE WITH OUR GRANDMOTHER BINGHAM, WHERE WE WERE GREATLY BLESSED, WE STILL FELT A GREAT LOSS AND A NEED FOR LOVE FROM OUR MOTHER'S FAMILY, AND IT WAS FREELY GIVEN TO US BY AUNT NELLIE AND UNCLE ED AND THEIR FAMILY, BY UNCLE GEORGE AND AUNT ROSE, BY UNCLE DELBERT AND AUNT CINDY, WHO MARRIED ABOUT THAT TIME, BY UNCLE FLOYD, BY LEON, AND ESPECIALLY BY UNCLE ELMER.

WHEN, IN ECONOMIC BAD TIMES, THEY MOVED SEVERAL TIMES TO IMPROVE THEMSELVES, THEY LEFT US AND WENT UP TO THE BURLEY AREA TO FARM, BUT SOMEHOW OR OTHER, UNCLE ELMER MANAGED TO COME VISIT WITH US QUITE OFTEN, EVEN COMING TO LIVE IN SLATERVILLE AGAIN FOR AWHILE.

WHEN I MARRIED, HE AND AUNT LeVIRL SOMETIMES CAME AND STAYED OVERNIGHT WITH US AND THUS THE FLAMES OF LOVE AND BLOOD TIES WERE KEPT FUELED, AND THROUGH THE YEARS WE KEPT IN TOUCH THROUGH TREASURED LETTERS.

UNCLE ELMER WAS A GOOD SON, A VERY GOOD HUSBAND, A TRUE BROTHER AND A GREAT UNCLE. INDEED HE WAS A GOOD MAN.

Come explore historic Chesterfield, nestled in the foothills of the beautiful Portneuf Valley was settled as a community by Mormon pioneers about 1881. It is a village frozen in time, with stately homes made of bricks crafted on the townsite, humble log homes, and some wood slat houses.

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the village has been a ghost town for a number of years. Its' history encompasses many facets of the old west including the Fur Trade era, famous military explorations, the Oregon Trail and the Mormon expansion, all as they were 100 years ago.

Located on the old Oregon Trail between Soda Springs and Fort Hall, Chesterfield is 11 miles north of Bancroft. The village is located near Chesterfield reservoir and 24 Mile Creek reservoir, which provide unique experiences for camping and fishing.

A group of concerned citizens is working to help preserve and restore the village under the auspices of the Chesterfield Foundation, Inc. There are 27 buildings and ruins on the townsite, seven of which are currently undergoing restoration and are available for tours.







CHESTERFIELD BRICK STORE

Built by Nathan Barlow and Judson H. Tolman about 1903, the Chesterfield store hosted a lively trade with farmers, stockmen, Indians from Fort Hall, and sportsmen. It was last operated by Joseph Holbrook in 1956. (Unrestored).



PIONEER MEETING HOUSE

Built by local craftsmen with hand-made brick between 1887 and 1892. Solid and secure, it now serves as a museum and relic hall. Maintained by Daughters of the Utah Pioneers.

CHESTERFIELD SCHOOL

Three room school built about 1920 after the earlier Victorian brick school burned. Restoration is nearly complete. The building, currently used as a community center, will become a museum and educational center.



JENSEN/LOVELAND CABIN

Built in the salt-box shape with a one and a half story gabled front, this is a favorite early-American house form dating back to Colonial times. (Unrestored).



IRA CALL CABIN

One of the earliest log homes built by a local merchant about 1882. For a short time it sheltered two polygamous families under one roof. (Partially restored).

HIGGINSON/HOLBROOK HOME

Built in the Queen Anne style about 1903. The most complicated design in town, complete with a tower and seven gables. (Partially restored).
