Camera Policy

Missionary Department

A great amount of a missionary's time and money can be wasted on cameras and picture-taking. To missionaries who desire to take a camera with them on their mission, strong counsel is given to take only an inexpensive, simple camera. No special lenses, tripods, or other attachments are to be taken to the mission field.

Picture-taking is limited to preparation days and special occasions approved by the mission president. Missionaries who carry cameras while proselyting give the appearance that they are affluent tourists rather than humble ministers of the gospel.

Please remember, too, that cameras are easily damaged or stolen.

- 4-5 * Properly fitted coordinated outfits of modest design (blouses, skirts, dresses, jackets, vests, jumpers, suits; no slitted skirts or dresses). Avoid large designs, motifs, lettering, or figures. T-shirts, golf and polo shirts, and sweat shirts should not be worn with skirts. Skirts should cover the knees when you are seated but not extend below mid-calf when standing. No floral prints, peasant-type or ankle length skirts, or wrinkled or unpressed fabrics.
- 12 * Nylon stockings and peds
- 3 * Pairs of shoes, conservative, comfortable; no suede or fad shoes
- 1 * Pair(s) of dress shoes for church meetings, conservative style/color
- 8-10 Pairs of garments; the enclosed yellow discount card is honored at all garment distribution centers
- Pajamas, robe, and slippers, as needed
- 8-10 * Handkerchiefs
- * Personal toiletries and underclothing as needed
- Handbag and jewelry; jewelry should be simple and modest
- * Raincoat, lightweight plastic or nylon
- Sweater(s), conservative, not tight-fitting, oversized, or faddish; no large designs
- * Set of clothing for work and special preparation-day activities; pants must be full-length
- Set of gym clothes, if desired
- Small first-aid kit, small sewing kit, wind-up or battery alarm clock, and laundry bag

* These items can be purchased in the mission field. Any additional questions should be referred to the mission.

BOOKS

Each missionary should have the recent LDS version of the standard works of the Church and a missionary journal.



- 8-10 * White shirts, wash and wear
- 2 * Suit(s), traditional style and cut, single breasted, dark colors; no sport coats
- 2 * Pairs of slacks, dark, conservative; no denims
- * Belts, black or dark brown, with conservative buckles
- 5-6 * Ties, conservative in both color and width
- 8-10 * Pairs of socks, solid, dark colored to match clothing
- 2 * Pairs of shoes, conservative, comfortable, oxford style, black or brown; no boots, suede, or fad shoes
- 8-10 Pairs of garments; the enclosed yellow discount card is honored at all garment distribution centers
- * Pajamas, robe, and slippers, as needed
- 8-10 * Handkerchiefs
- * Raincoat, lightweight plastic or nylon
- * Personal toiletries and shaving equipment, as needed
- Set of baptismal clothing
- Set of clothing for work and special preparation-day activities; pants must be full-length
- Set of gym clothes, if desired

* These items can be purchased in the mission field. Any additional questions should be referred to the mission.

MONEY

The average cost per couple is \$800 per month with variations according to area.

You should arrive in the mission field with at least \$1,100 for supplies and your first month's expenses. In case of emergencies, you should always have on hand about \$50. Your monthly mission funds can be handled in several ways. There are two, however, that have proven to be the best. (1) You can establish a personal checking account, with overdraft protection, through a bank in your hometown. Arrangements have been made for you to cash

these checks in the mission field. Funds can be deposited into the account at home and the monthly statement can be sent to your sponsor. You should take enough checks for your entire mission. You should always have a balance of at least \$255. (2) Money can be sent to you by either cashiers's check or regular bank check.

BOOKS

Each missionary should have the recent LDS version of the standard works of the Church and a missionary journal. Each couple may bring a copy of the following books: Jesus the Christ, Articles of Faith, A Marvelous Work and a Wonder, Truth Restored and Gospel Principles.

MISCELLANEOUS

Do not bring expensive camera equipment, a radio, a clock-radio, recorded music, or any musical instrument.

Medical expenses for treatment of conditions existing prior to the mission will continue to be the responsibility of the family. Medical expenses for illnesses or accidents occurring in the field which cannot be covered by family insurance will be paid out of church funds.

While on your mission, you should make your whereabouts known to your Social Security office and any other agency or group who provide you funds.

For those with special medical problems who want information regarding a service to help medical personnel identify unusual conditions that require special treatment, you may contact Medical Alert Foundation, 5148 Lori Way, Salt Lake City, Utah, 84117, (801) 261-2058. This is not medical or accident insurance. If you have any questions call your doctor or pharmacist.

If you have been assigned to an English-speaking mission you will stay at the Missionary Training Center (MTC) for about three weeks of orientation and training. If you have been assigned to learn a language for your mission, you will remain at the MTC for two months of orientation, gospel, and language training.

TRAVEL

For those who will be flying to their missions, Murdock Travel, of Salt Lake City, has been authorized by the Church to handle your travel arrangements. You will receive official instructions from them which you should follow very carefully. If necessary for your mission, Murdock Travel may request that you send them certain documents required for a visa. If you are not able to submit these documents by the requested date, your call may need to be delayed or changed to another mission. If you have questions or problems, contact Murdock Travel (phone 801-521-7850).

CHECK-IN

PLEASE ARRIVE AT THE MTC APPROPRIATELY DRESSED IN MISSIONARY ATTIRE AND WITH A PROPER MISSIONARY HAIRCUT.

You should report on Wednesday by 11:30 a.m. Please eat lunch before you arrive at the MTC. A special orientation for missionaries and their families will begin at 1:00 p.m.

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU ARRIVE AT THE DESIGNATED CHECK-IN TIME. If you encounter any difficulty that would delay your arrival or if it is necessary to come to the MTC a day early to meet the check-in schedule, please call (801) 378-2602 and explain your circumstances. Only a limited number of early arrivals can be accommodated, so please do not come early unless it is necessary to do so, and please give the MTC as much advance notice as possible.

If you need transportation from downtown Salt Lake City to Provo, you should board the Continental Trailways, Greyhound bus, or Utah Transit Authority Bus. Please make travel arrangements to arrive in Provo by the suggested check-in time. For Greyhound and Trailways the bus fare is approximately \$5.00 and approximately \$2.00 for UTA. If taxi service is not available from the Provo bus station to the MTC, please call 378-2602, and transportation arrangements will be made.

4. Make checks payable to MTC for room and board, and the MTC Bookstore for training materials.
5. Scriptures and other materials in your mission language may be purchased at the MTC bookstore.
6. Missionaries may purchase travelers' checks at the MTC at no charge.

ITEMS TO BRING:

When you arrive at the MTC, you will need to have on your person (not in your luggage) the following items:

- A current temple recommend. You will go to the temple once a week while at the MTC.
- A copy of your completed immunization form.
- One passport or wallet-size photo for your branch president's files at the MTC.
- Pertinent health insurance information (such as name and address of the insurance company, the policyholder's name, the policy number, identification number, group number, etc.), if you have insurance coverage.

You will also need to bring (in your luggage):

- Soap and towel
- Gym clothes (Note: Do not bring black-soled gym shoes to the MTC.) A sweatsuit is recommended.
- Clothes hangers
- Iron, if desired (not provided by MTC)

Please put your name on each piece of luggage, clothing, and other belongings. Bedding will be provided by the MTC.

BEFORE YOU ENTER THE MTC YOU SHOULD:

- Resolve all medical and dental problems. Most medical expenses incurred on your mission which are not covered by family insurance will be paid by the Church. Major items not included are: Chiropractic treatments, eye and dental care, prescriptions. Those who have insurance coverage may desire to continue it throughout their mission.
- If you are flying to your field of labor, we encourage you to purchase the accident and baggage insurance offered through Murdock Travel for \$30.00. Part of this insurance covers expenses up to \$500.00 for each accidental injury incurred during your mission. If you are traveling by car your auto insurance will usually be sufficient.

If you will need transportation from Salt Lake International Airport to the MTC in Provo, you should phone Key Limousine (801) 224-4660 in advance and reserve a seat on one of their scheduled vans. Be prepared to tell Key Limousine personnel the date, arrival time, airline, and flight number of your scheduled flight. Payment for this service (\$13.00-ask for missionary discount) should be made directly to the limousine driver.

Family and friends should plan to bid farewell at the Missionary Training Center after attending a brief orientation presentation with you.

FINANCES (AT THE MTC)

1. Missionaries assigned to English-speaking missions will have the following expenses:
 - a. \$8.00 per day per person for room and board. Senior missionaries will pay for their board and room just before they leave the MTC.
 - b. Approximately \$45.00 to \$75.00 per person for training materials. (Please have a separate check for this amount when you arrive.)
 - c. \$25.00 per person for personal expenses.
2. Missionaries assigned to learn a language will have the following expenses:
 - a. \$8.00 per day per person for room and board. Senior missionaries will pay for their board and room just before they leave the MTC.
 - b. Approximately \$100.00 to \$125.00 per person for training materials. (Please have a separate check for this amount when you arrive.)
 - c. \$50.00 Personal expenses.
3. Missionaries going to Brazil and some other foreign countries are required to submit results of chest x-rays, blood and other tests when applying for a visa. Most of these have to be done at the MTC as they must be done in a prescribed way and within a certain time frame. Missionaries going to some countries require Cholera or Yellow Fever immunizations. Therefore missionaries going to foreign countries should arrive with an additional \$30 or \$40 to cover the cost of these expenses.


- Complete all vaccinations and inoculations, in accordance with the information enclosed with your call letter.
- If applicable and where feasible, receive your endowment at the temple in your area.
- Enclosed with your call letter was a yellow discount card which you can use to purchase a limited number of garments at the Relief Society Distribution Center. To obtain a discount you will need to take this card with you. Missionaries may also use this card for a discount at some other stores, particularly in Utah, for clothing or book purchases.
- Be set apart for your mission by your stake president or, if you live in a mission district, by your mission president.
- If you have not had a patriarchal blessing and wish to obtain one, please do so in your stake before entering the MTC. We suggest that you bring a copy with you.
- Check your driver's license to make sure it will not expire while you are in the mission field. If it will expire before you return home, it would be well for you to make any necessary renewal applications before you enter the MTC. Please contact your local state driver's license bureau for instructions on renewing your license. It may be necessary for you to submit a copy of the missionary call letter in order to verify that you have been called to serve a mission and will be out of the area for an extended period.

DEPARTURE

You will receive information on traveling to your mission, including the date, when you arrive at the MTC. Friends, ward members, and relatives are welcome to bid farewell when the missionary enter the MTC rather than at the Salt Lake International Airport. However, if the immediate family feels the need, they may go to the airport. They should bid farewell in the main lobby area, and should not accompany the missionary through the security check to the loading gate.

We received a letter from Mother, Mr. Wimmer and from Leona Sully with a \$25⁰⁰ check. They got here Friday. Leona's was written 6th February, and Wimmers the 3rd Feb. Mothers the 15th Feb. Crazy.

The weather has been nice. Foggy up on temple hills and a little showery here. Yesterday it was beautiful. Didn't wear sweaters. The trees and flowers are leafing & blooming, although some are producing fruit, like oranges and lemons. Partly cloudy this morning but nice. Different than Utah weather.

We went to church which is on Alameda Island. A returned Russian missionary from here in the branch spoke. He went to Penn. He spoke in Russian and we wear hearing device and an interpreter sits on the stand & tells us in English what he is saying. He translates English to the Russian when English is spoken. The translator is a white young man who came back here and married a pretty Russian girl. I believe they had 2 children.

The returned missionary's name is Billy. Short but good looking. His friend Johnny was a companion to him on their mission in Pennsylvania. He is a Russian also. He is going to B.Y.U. He came here to speak at Sac. with Billy. Taller & nice looking. The young girls were hanging around both of them.

The girls are beautiful, ^{at least} most of them. They have beautiful black hair & dark brown eyes. The little

ones & some older kids like American names. Christensen & we had a load to the dance at the Stake center by the temple. They dress very nice. They like to wear black and white. With ribbons or clips in their hair - make up - ^{frills} ~~frills~~.

We had 19 boys & girls sing in Church Sunday in English.

Christensen went back after the dance ended at 11. to take a bunch home. Takes us hour to deliver.

Yesterday (Mon) was P. day. I washed & dried clothes. The machines are out under the bldg. by the car port. Do a lot of chasing. Later we went to the grocery store with Leona. a small shopping mall near by.

Came home and Mrs. Davies wanted me to go with her

to buy shoes. We went to Alameda Island. Over the bridge instead of the tube under water. a big clean shopping mall there. The streets are wider and cleaner in Alameda. Of course there is a big Naval Air Station in the area. We were gone 3 hrs. Dad thought we were way-laid. Then we have a Christ. meeting each Monday ^{evening} with the missionary couples, on the of their apartments. We have a Christ. leader. We sing, pray, repeat the 4th Sec. & Standard of Truth, then a lesson from the missionary guide. Then a treat is served.

I wrote to Jack today. We hope he is getting along. Evelyn said she talked to Valerie and the doctors are doing the treatment different than the first time.

I also wrote to Mother & Evelyn & thank you to Leona. We are sending them today

at the little post office down the road from us. Don't know what the schedule is today. Christensen's aren't feeling well, so we may go look for address.

If you use the van the Church pays the gas. you pay the gas for your car. Keep the mail & bills coming. They will catch us.

Glad Nate is doing fine.

We are in our apt. It was hastily decorated. We are in it temporarily for about 6 weeks. The couple we are replacing are leaving for Provo. Their year is up. We are on a upper floor. The other place is on ground level. We have 2 bedrooms and one is empty. No curtains in kitchen or spare bedroom. Front room drape is shrunken & we pin it shut. No kitchen chairs yet. Finally got two lamps. All the missionaries' apts. are I.T. furniture. We are going there tomorrow. The weather was clear and the roads dry all the way, except for some spots by the S.F. airport. Weather was cold. We ~~stayed~~ ^{ate} at Circus Circus in Reno. Supper + breakfast. The rooms were \$25.00 at Showboat. Supper \$4.12 apiece + 2.50 for breakfast. Very cold there. Dad said 1st time he didn't gamble. Sister Davies said the same. We got over the Donner Pass. Snow on the sides of the road but road was dry. About 60 miles from Reno to outskirts of Sac. Freeways + lots of traffic. We tailed the Davies all the way. She knows the way. Got into Oakland & got separated at a stop light. We stayed on McArthur road until we came to Rincón and went right to the temple and found the mission home. Davies was there. We all met the Mission Pres. Jensen. He is friendly + nice. After chatting he gave us our assignment. Davies working with Colene + we with the Pastors Branch. We met the Christensen from Provo. They will leave her Mar. 23. They took us to the store. Later we all met (8 couples) at a couples ^{apt.} home and ate potluck supper to get

acquainted. One couple knew Faye Bibby father. And one knew the couple in our class at the M+C. We met 4 Elders. One is type. but raised in America. We went with Christensen this a.m. to meet with 6 Pastors families. All live in humble 2 rooms. Bed to Bed. They really don't know how to keep house. Speak broken English or none at all. Very courteous + friendly. Kids are cute. Black hair + eyes. Short people. Some cleaning or cutting up chicken. Some strong members, or weak or not at all. We haven't got our assignment at all. Don't know the roads or address's or where the church house is at. Have a lot to learn. We haven't got all the basic groceries yet + been to the store twice. Keep needing things. We walked 3 blocks to one store today. These are the apt. complex Dennis lived in. Down is # 11 but don't know the bldg. # as yet. It is noisy here. I wrote to Mother + Evelyn today also. The grass is green and oranges on trees.

We are to attend a baptism tonight. Don't know where tho.

The Christensen's said we could use their mailbox until they move.

We had a correlation meeting at Christensen with Elder Jorenson & Seawson. We ate lunch there. She & I walked down to Kucky store for a few groceries. I bought the beans & cheese. Later we went visiting 3 families. ~~Some~~ ^{& Aylthavane} young 15 yr. old boy member. Parents not. Khampassat Nook. 17 yr. old just married. 2763-35th St.

We went to help Lewanlawank ^{& Nulboud} Maophasent move to a nice home 3 blocks from the apt. Elders, cousin & us helped. They used the van. We stopped for a burrito & drink. Home at 8:00'clock. I was cold so had a hot bath & warm milk.

March 2, 1989 Rainy morning. Cold wind blowing P.M. Christensen went with us to Zone meeting at Stake Center. Edward drove. Fr. meeting. Zone leader Elder Chapman conducting. Sister & Pres. Jensen spoke. Testimony meeting later. Elder & Sister Christensen bore testimony & said farewell. I bore my testimony also. We received 2 15th Ward Cook Book & letter from (Chelma Naef our Relief Society Pres -) I sent \$2.00 for a book and an anonymous donor sent an extra one. She sent a long newsey letter. Enjoyed it. Received a lonely letter from Mother to - Rain in Ogden. She is fine. The family is upset with Travis living with the gal - living by Mother. We went to the B.O. and got the Cashier Check \$400.00 refund on cancelled tour sent by Evelyn, plus a long letter from her telling us about Marlene, Witt, Blake, David, Clay, she & Bruce. Paying the car debt off. Visiting Mother, Kurt & Nate. Plan on visiting us this summer. Received two church news sec. Edward & I stopped at grocery store. Spent \$11.00 Evelyn sent newspaper clipping of Anderson son & a filed family of Harriette death. I read this scripture in Church news sec. & it impressed me. H & C 121: 7-9 "My son, peace be unto thy soul, thine afflictions shall be but a small ~~amount~~ moment; And then, if thou endure it well, God shall exalt thee on high; thou shalt triumph over all thy foes. Thy friends do stand by thee, and they shall hail thee again with warm hearts and friendly hands".

We went to Long's for milk, catering & make-up. ^{5:00} We received a letter from Bruce. City had to replace our water meter. At brake. No charge to us. Sent V.A. bill, Blue Cross & Credit Union statements. Got our phone bill from here.

March 4, 1989 Saturday - Showery 9-11 - We sent telephone bill \$32.91. Made checks out \$34.18 to Arthur C. Assessor for 81 Mercury car. Davies went with us to Alameda to the swap meet. Rain so most everyone left. We bought umbrellas, mirrors, gadgets (brace) oranges and grapefruit. Spent \$7.55. Brewery stopped at Buckley \$22.00 ~~Alameda~~ ^{Alameda} on High St. over the bridge, back thru the tunnel + freeway home. We enjoyed the morning. Christensen went visiting saying good-bye to the people they have met. No valley ball today. Inter-area dinner-dance at Stake Center tonight. We went to the Dinner - (Roast Beef + all the trimmings). Decorated like Camelot + King Arthur Times. Castles, warrens, horses, flags. Lot came in costume of the era. Helped clear tables. 700- people or so. (8 wards + 9 branches).

March 5, 1989 Sunday. Cloudy, cold - Showers. Mother called us early. She is getting over sinus + feels better. Big storm their on Thursday. Snow almost gone. Bev had been sick. I wrote to Bev today. Said Marlene + Will looking for rings. He was checking into the service. Mother said she put some money in the checking account.

March 5, 1989 Sunday Mother called early this morning. Need to hear her voice and talk awhile. Had her had sinus again but felt better.

We went to Church. Left at 10:05 A.M. to pick up people. It was testimony meeting - Fast Day. Elder Christensen drove first and Edward drove home. He is starting to recognize places. Ate dinner. I wrote a thank you card to Naef's for sending the cookbooks. Sent \$2.00 for postage. Finished Bev's letter. Rance Christensen called to tell us we are invited with them to Bouma and Nouanpheng Khaoth for dinner on Tuesday Evening at 2116 Foothill Blvd. # 2. We later studied map to locate address and roads. Edward read awhile. Rain tonight.

March 6, 1989 Monday. Showery. Sunny + warm + showery again. I washed + dried clothes, and cleaned the floors + vacuumed the rugs. This is our P day. We walked to Walgreen Drug + got my films of m.t.c. Turned out good. \$3.12. We walked to the Produce store for celery + bananas. I made stew + dumplings. We went with Christensen in the van to Seminary + Morse to a black couple (Ma Green). They gave us lots of clothes to take to R.S. home making for the Nation People. We went to Hong + Lela Kamhong and gave them clothes. Mrs. Green collects, washes, iron + repairs them. Bence Christensen visited awhile. Later we went to Davies to visit. They served us ice cream. Showed them the pictures taken at the m.t.c. Received a letter from Bruce. He got the money and he sent us the Blue Cross check from Edwards medicine. Everything is fine at home. Received a long letter from Lee + Parue. He wrote 2 pages. Parue went to Provo with Wayne, Rudean + girls to meet Blaine's fiancée from Tremonton. Plan on 12 may wedding. Visited + ate ice cream with the Davies.

Tuesday March 7, 1989. We ate breakfast. Had our regular morning prayer. Not ready to attend Zone Correlation meeting at Stake Center when Sister Christensen let us know it was cancelled. She, Edward & I drove to the mission Home & used their copier to run off 2 different branch invitations. One for Branch party on Friday Eve. & Home making at P.S. in Alameda. She & I went to Safeways & left Edward's trousers at the cleaner. Had 2 Elders & us 4 to correlation meeting. all came here (except Elder Sorenson) for ^{toast} tuna fish sandwiches - cheese, pickles, cookies & ice cream. We (Christensen & me) went into Oakland to meet Mary Satterton. She was concerned about income tax papers for her bro. & sister-in-law and also car insurance. We visited D. om Lay Senephaneri (Jennifer's mother. She is a nice lady. Was Pres. of Primary - Doesn't attend church. Has a young live-in boyfriend & has a cute 3 yr. old boy (brown) her daughter Cynthia ~~is~~ ^{ran} away. Out looking for her. We then went to Berkeley to talk to tutor if she knew anything, but didn't. Come home & had Christensen's hot bowl of noodles with us. Put the clothes from Helen gave us in the van & we went to Alameda to Ward Leader Correlation meeting - 2 hrs. long. Got home at 10:00' clock. Received a nice long letter from Florence Morain. She only visits Rakelia Palmer. She & Mother visit by phone - glad they keep in contact. Received copy of letter from mission Pres. giving direction from L. A. Edgley. Don't baptize children without written consent of parents.

Wednesday March 8, 1989 Showery day. Went with Christensen all over town to deliver flyers for Branch Party & Home making day. They took us to lunch. Soup & sandwiches. He got a '73 parking ticket. Meter expired. Went to the Mission Home & Book Store. Got home at 6:00' clock. Received a welcome letter from Mother - she is so faithful to write. She put \$100.00 in our checking account. I wrote & told her ^{not to send} the money as we were getting along ok. She wants to help us. Eld. Christensen used the phone to try and find the missing girl. Called a business place in S.F. Received a long letter from Joan Keriffen. He sweet of her to write. She & Bruce are going to Florida for meetings & to visit their daughter & family. Also got a post card from Spencer in Florida. They are working with the Cambodians. At 6:40 the four of us delivered more flyers then we went to Bounma and Nouanpleng Khiasoth home (apt. 2116 Foothill Blvd #2 for a nice Rastan dinner. He wasn't home still working at the Bakery. We had a noodle dish, egg roll (yummy) shrimp & pineapple dish and steamed trout & sprouts. They live in small apt. Had dishes of food on floor - no table except the card table we ate at. Talked & took pictures. She & husband are active church members & hold temple recommends. Nice time. Home at 10:00' clock.

Thursday March 9, 1989. Michelle's 15th Birthday. Overcast & a light rain at times. Today we went to the bank and put \$105.00 insurance check in the bank here. We drove up to Safeways and spent \$34.00 in groceries. Washed some sheets. Paid Mr. Becker \$376.00 for rent. Visited them for a while. He told us his daughter wrecked their car last week on their way to Utah. He bought them a new ^{Sally's} ~~new~~ truck.

Today we received letters & insurance paper from Bruce. He is anxious to start work at FRS on 21st afraid of being over. Brenda has been substituting teaching for her dad. He has the flu. Got a long letter from Evelyn. She is taking a computer class at the high school. David had strep throat but better now. Marlene may get her ring this week. Will didn't pass Army exam. Sent invitation to family reunion at Crystal Springs. Sounds so fun. Hate to miss it. So close to home this time. Received a nice letter from Betty Orzill & \$10.00 check & a short letter from Rep. Derwin. Saw on word news. Received a nice letter from Kertrude & \$25.00 check. She is doing fine. Said Jack is really sick. Not responding to meds as well as last time. We say our prayers for all our family at home.

Friday March 10, 1989 Cloudy. Sec. Christensen & I went to the drugstore, Safeway and school supply stores. She bought paper, ~~green~~ white to make 4 leaf clover decorations. I helped cut them out. Made jello fruit salad. Wrote letters to Mr. Kert, Evelyn & our Bruce. Rec'd temporary Utah Inspection Form from Utah & sent it and a car tape in the mail. We went to Alameda Church Home. Helped decorate tables & set tables & put cloths out on tables for Branch Party. Primary in charge but no Presiding there. Fairly nice crowd. Potluck supper. Surprise: Betty & Derwin Orzill (Rep. Orzill) called at 10:00 clock P.M. to ask how we were doing. So good to hear from them. All ok at home. She sent us \$10.00 for Easter.



some money. I told her I would take pictures & a write up of us.




When my wife & I were deciding whether to go on this mission because of a few circumstances we were concerned with. We ~~had~~ ^{had} prayed about it for a couple of days & nights and had not received an answer.

The answer came to me on Nov 4 as we assembled for fast & testimony meeting when my wife handed me a passages from the lesson the relief society had been using prior to testimony meeting that morning.

I read these few words: So rather than saying, "I will not move until I have this burning in my heart, let us turn it around and say, I will move, unless I feel it is wrong, and if it is wrong ~~and if it is wrong~~ there I will not do it. I will repeat that.

It hit me like a bolt of lightning & my heart began pounding so hard I could hardly contain it.

I could hardly wait until the sacrament had been passed and the time for testimony bearing.

Needless to say I was the first to get up & bear witness that I had received an answer to my prayer and that we were going to accept this mission call.

Besides leaving my wife 9 1/2 year old ~~and the mother behind~~ ^{and other concerns} we were concerned about financing this mission.

We had accepted the call and received a letter from the Oakland Mission President that it would cost \$100.00 month to finance the mission and that was about \$25.00 a month more than we could really afford. ^{Now listen to what happened.}

We received \$1200.00 in donations at our farewell and we have a returned sister missionary ^{in our ward} that has never married and out of the Blue she told my wife that for several yrs. she has been sending different missionaries \$25.00 a month and that the last missionary was ^{ending} ~~his~~ ^{his} mission and she would like to donate \$25.00 a month while we are on this mission.

The Lord works in mysterious ways. By (depositing) the \$1200.00 in the bank as a reserved donation and our pension we will be receiving and the \$25.00 from this sister at home (it is a testimony to me that the Lord provides the way to bless anyone that will live in accordance with his gospel and living his commandments.

Our Mondays ~~was~~ ^{was} preparation day and it gave us time to wash clothes, grocery shop or do as we like.

at 6:00 PM the P. Day ended and we had a family home evening with 7 other couples or picnic.

The time was taken up by having a lesson by whomever turn it was to sponsor the evening and singing, bearing testimonies and having refreshments. The meetings lasted between 3 + 1/2 hrs. attended different apartments

after two hrs I was ready to go home so the last part was not as pleasant as the first year

Elder + Sister Christiansen were our trainers and they ~~showed us~~ ^{showed us} and took us to many homes. Some in slum areas + some in fairly decent neighborhoods.

most people were or welfare ^{that we visited} in this country they are not allowed to work but are sent to school to help them learn American customs + the American language.

The U.S. Govt sponsored many families that were in refugee camps and they agreed to pay \$40.00 a month for each adult in a family.

many had a difficult time escaping from the Communist Governments in Laos + Thailand and many families had lost loved ones by drowning or by being shot. ^{we heard many gruesome experiences.}

when the missions were first established in the Oakland area they had what they call mattress baptisms.

The Elders promised the refugees that first arrived that if they would come to our church 3 times that the LDS church would give them a bed + a mattress which was approved and encouraged by our church authorities.

It might have brought a few members into the church but there was too many that received the bed + mattress and did not come to church again so they stopped that practice.

Then the Branches obtained two large buses and transported several ethnic groups to different churches but it was costing the church \$70000 a week to do that so they asked for church members to donate some vans which they did and let members of different wards shuttle them to church + other activities.

That went on for awhile and the ward members got tired of that so they shovled the job off to the senior missionaries.

The church paid for the expense on the vans but like the Davies had a new car and the station wagon ^{church owned} had been using broke down.

The mission authorities decided not to repair it so here they were making three trips a day to bring the Chinese to church + using their own gas and the church will not reimburse the gas used in private vehicles even though it is for the same purpose.

although all the other senior missionaries all brought their ethnic groups to church we were the only ones to shuttle them to sports activities.

groups into other branches getting help from other groups that did not have any thing to do with them before.

Now if you are getting the idea that there was a few things I didn't like about the mission we were on you are absolutely right.

But in the M.T.C. by the post office there was a picture of Christ and the Captive that says: 'I did not say it would be easy; I said it would be worth it.'

That pretty well sums up missionary work. Some things are pleasant & others are not. Recs. Reverse of D.T.C.H.C. That says that if you fulfill an honorable mission it will bring you gain, salvation, & forgiveness. It was because of that that we decided to go on a mission.

We were contented while on our mission and would still be there if my mother-in-law had not become ill even though I was having trouble with my back & legs before going and seem to be becoming progressively worse.

Now our mission has ended what do we do we have left to gain our salvation.

Some of the things that come to my mind are we can pay our ~~taxes~~ full tithing, pay a generous fast offering, help pay a fair share of the ward budget, accept ward assignments & attend church meetings.

We are sorry things turned out as it did and hope we can do something to help compensate for not finishing our mission.

when we dwelt in the presence of God we were endowed with agency. We are expected to use the gifts and

and Oakland blind folded.

we had an old Blue Chev. Van and he enjoyed driving in heavy traffic and it seemed to tickle him to think he missed several cars by only 2 or 3 ft on ~~the~~ ^{each} trip. The top leaked.

There was the bay on ~~the~~ one side and a range of hills on the other and the sun always came up in the south & I don't know to this day where it went down.

When it became dark or it was raining & foggy I was completely lost I could not see the hills. a lot of times I would think we ~~should~~ go one direction and inevitably he would go another which was correct. It took five weeks to get to know the route we were to take to pick up people.

The van had room for 12 people & we had as many as 20 and the kids tried to outdo each other laughing & shouting and talking ~~laughing~~ most of the time I had to take out my hearing aids. I could not take it.

No one dare correct them for afraid of offending them.

No reverence during sacrament meeting. Some were arm wrestling or poking each other or visit ing while sacrament was being passed.

I swore to myself that I would halt all the noise while riding in the van when ~~we~~ it be- came our turn to take over full responsibilities.

We only ~~shuttled~~ shuttled them one time after the Christiansens left when we ~~to~~ heard Shuleys mother was very ill and decided to come home. I did not get the chance to try & teach them to be quiet while I was dodging traffic.
